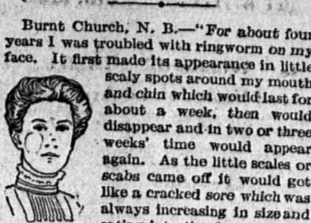

Test For Hydrochloric Acid. A curious mishap gave us a very delicate test for hydrochloric acid in the atmosphere. In a north of England locality many houses have curtains of the cream color produced by means of yellow, popularly known as "dolly" cream dye and to science as "the sodium salt of meta-amido-benzene sulphonic acid-azo-diphenyl-aniline." Some of these cream colored curtains suddenly changed to heliotrope. Investigation showed that an accidental escape of hydrochloric acid from a neighboring alkali plant had discolored the curtains, and the dye became a most useful test.—London Globe.

GERMANIZATION OF HOLLAND.

LONDON, July 21.—A despatch from the Hague to the Standard says that after two years of persistent diplomatic exchanges Germany has induced Holland to permit the construction of a German private

harbor and steel works on the northern bank of the new waterway connecting Rotterdam with the North Sea, pointing out that it would be perfectly practicable for the company to build up under the guise of a commercial undertaking something like a German naval base, and that

it would be impossible in the event of an European war for the Netherlands to enforce neutrality. The correspondent adds that thoughtful observers at the Hague regard the incident as a step towards the Germanization of Holland.
