HORSE BACKED OVER WHARF AND WAS DROWNED

ST. JOHN, Feb. 3.—A drowning accident in which a horse owned by Richard Rider was the victim took place yesterday afternoon about 3 o'clock at the wharf where the Grand Manan steamer Aurora docks. The accident was a rather peculiar one and was caused by the driver not being able to control the animal. Rider was engaged to some carting for the firm of Baird & Peters. It was while he was working on the wharf back of their place of business that the accident occurred. He was about to turn his wagon when the horse became unmanageable and backed the driver over the wharf. The water in this slip is very deep and almost before Rider realized what had happened his horse and wagon were entirely submerged. Persons standing on the wharf at the time started to get ropes, thinking they might be able to save the horse, but their efforts were of no avail for it was kept under water by the weight of the sliver. This is the third horse which Rider has lost within a year, and naturally he feels the loss keenly. He had

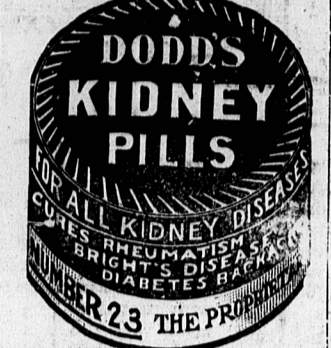
purchased the horse three months ago at the cost of nearly \$100.

STRIKE LEADERS SENT TO PRISON.

SYDNEY, N. S. W., Feb. 1.—President Bowling, of the Northern Miners Federation, was yesterday convicted of obstructing work at the mines during the strike and sentenced to one year at hard labor in prison. Three other strike leaders were given sentences each of eight months at hard labor, while a number of miners were condemned to briefer terms of imprisonment.

NEW YORK, Feb. 1.—Albert T. Patrick, who has been a prisoner for nearly ten years and is now serving a life sentence in Sing Sing prison for the murder of William Marsh Rice, was today formally disbarred as a practicing lawyer by the appellate division of the supreme court. Taking advantage of his position as a member of the bar, Patrick has been able to fight his case for years. 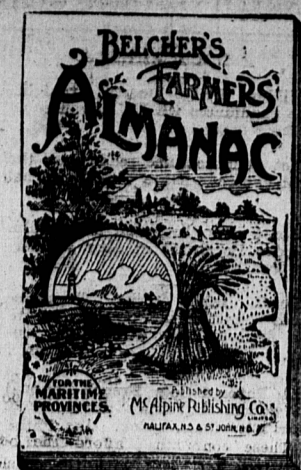

MEAT TRUST IN TROUBLE.

NEW YORK, Feb. 3.—The Mexican Packing Co., a New Jersey corporation controlled by English investors and operating a slaughter and packing house in Mexico, under concessions from the Mexican Government, has failed with liabilities of \$37,000,000. The assets are not announced, but they are in excess of liabilities.

ANOTHER MINE DISASTER.

LAREDO, Texas, Feb. 3.—One of the greatest disasters in the history of the Mexican Coal Mining Co. took place yesterday in Palau Mine, at Las Esperanzas.
The toll of human life is officially placed at fifty-six, while the list of the injured numbers nearly as many. The explosion is attributed to the ignition of gas by a cigarette of a miner, who was smoking contrary to rules.

DOUBLE DOMESTIC TRAGEDY.

TORONTO, Feb. 3.—William Bell, a laborer, cut his wife's throat with a razor yesterday, and then tried to cut his own, in a room over the Trader's Bank.
The bank-clerks down stairs heard someone scarpam, but thought that it was the children playing and paid no attention until Mrs. Bell came staggering down stairs and collapsed in front of the entrance.

ANOTHER MINE EXPLOSION.

PRIMERO, Colo., Feb. 3.—Monday's explosion in the mine of the "Colorado Fuel Co." claimed a total of seventy-five victims and left thirty-five widows and sixty-five fatherless children.
