#### MRS. JAMES C. CLARK

As the rays of the morning sun was bringing to life another Sabbath day, September 25th, the gentle spirit of Mrs. James C. Clark winged its way from earthly toil and sorrow to the home beyond to meet her loved ones gone before, whom she so sorely missed.

Stricken last June with a bad heart attack, she had been in delicate health all summer, and the end came very suddenly. She was born at Hampshire in 1856 so had attained the good old age of 82 but never seemed old as we count age by years, as she always was so bright and cheery, making her a general favorite with young and old.

In 1880 she married James C. Clark of North Wilshire, where they lived till 1908 when they moved West settling in Arlington Beach, Sask. There they built up one of the prettiest farms in the west, as they were both lovers of trees, flowers, and all things beautiful.

After her husband's death in 1927 she and her little granddaughter lived alone for a number of years. Since then she has made her home with her sons, Nelson in Simpson, and Russell at Beachy. A funeral service was held at Beachy on Monday afternoon, the remains then being taken to Simpson, where the funeral was held from her son's residence on Tuesday afternoon.

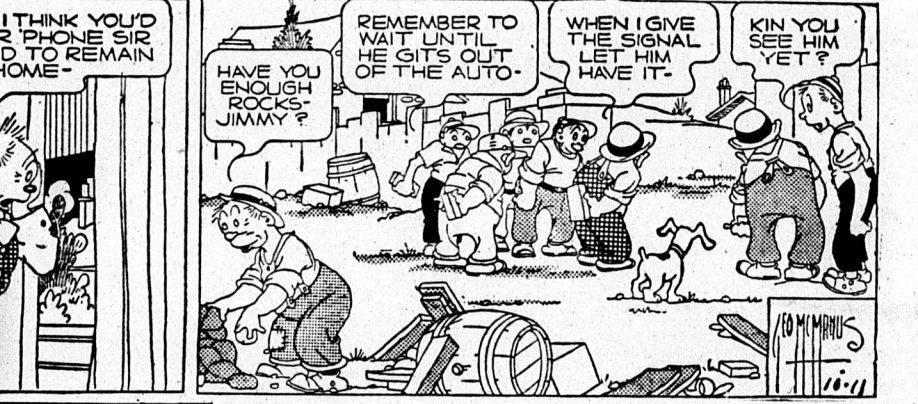
Friends from far and near were there to pay their last respects to one who had mingled with them so much in life.

There are left to mourn a loving mother, her two sons one

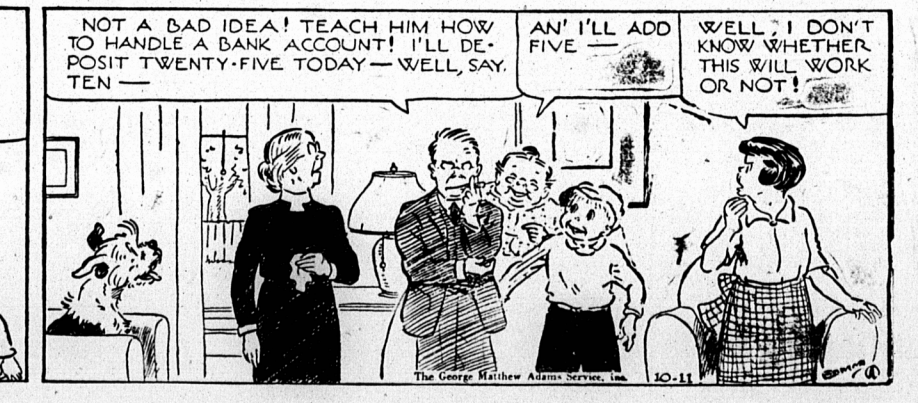
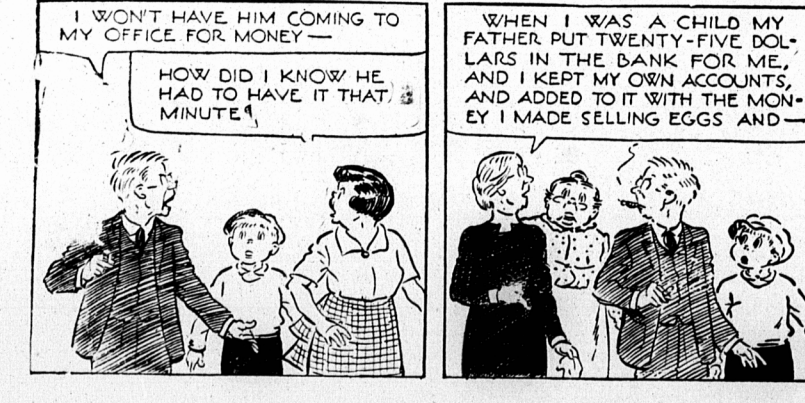

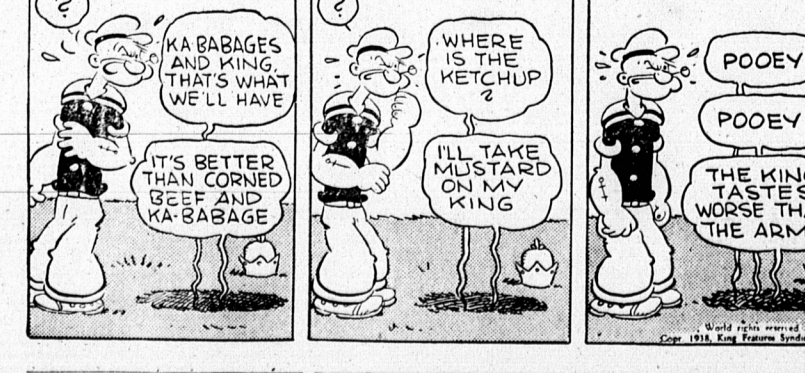
