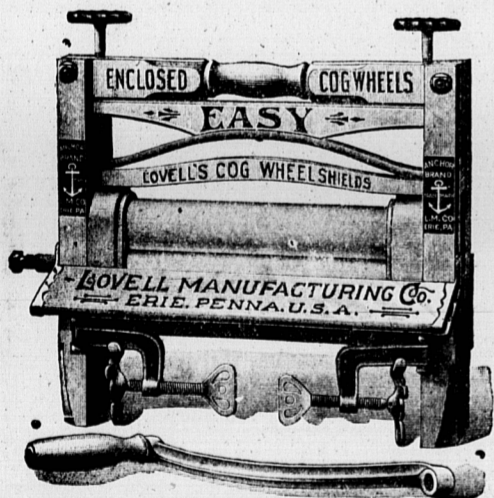

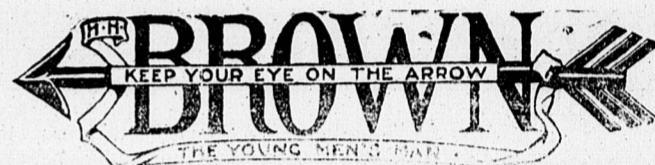

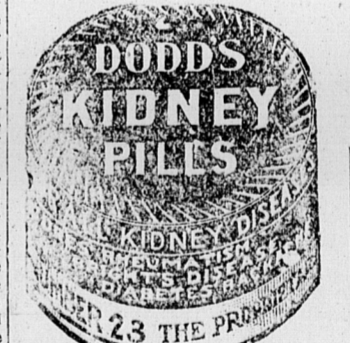

BIG ROBBERY IN NEW YORK.

NEW YORK, November 5—Robbers boarded the Hamburg-American liner, Prince Joachim lying at the pier here, two days ago, jimmied the open safe in the purser's office and got away with \$2,000 in gold.
