## MISS LE NEVE

The London Mail of a recent date, has the following with regard to Miss Le Neve

"A heart-broken appeal to her daughter, Ethel LeNeve was cabled on Sunday by Mrs Charlotte Le Neve (Neave.)

Well-nigh distracted with grief, Mrs LeNeve was sobbing bitterly as she despatched the message. "The news that my darling has actually been arrested was," she said, "at first a terrible shock, but I am certain that she is innocent and that she has to do us to tell the police everything she knows of the dreadful affair. Very very little she does know--of that I feel sure.

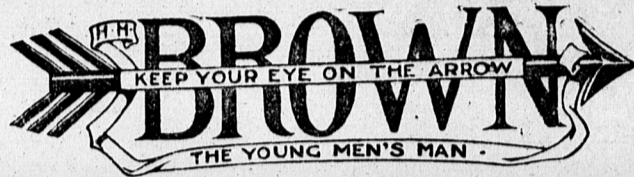

## CHARGES THAT THREE MEN CONTROL MILK BUSINESS

BOSTON, Aug. 20--Alleging that three men control the milk business in Boston and that they are operating in violation of the Sherman Act, George Albrece of Concord, considered the largest farmer in Massachusetts, urged the interstate commerce commission to do what it could to break up this alleged combination.

Mr. Albrece's statement made more or less of a sensation when it was sprung in room 55 of the Federal building, where the interstate commerce commission is investigating the new rates established by the Boston & Maine Railroad for the transportation of milk.

Attorney William B. Sears for H.P. Hood & Co., was the first witness this morning. He confined his arguments largely to the small percentage of profit of the milk contractor. He maintained that the average profit to his clients for retail trade is less than one-half a mill per quart and that the profits on their wholesale trade amounts to about one-half a cent per can.

Myron Pierce, representing the milk consumers' association, urged the collection of milk by night rather than by day, contending that the present practice results in the delivery of third-day milk. He contended, also, that the present type of refrigerator cars is most imperfect and insisted that a modern car, containing a single compartment, which is easily flushed and kept clean, should be inaugurated.

Stanley H. Abbott, representing the Boston co-operative milk producers' company, said that it is absolutely essential that the near-by farmer should have nothing added to his transportation expense. The former system of leased cars, he claimed, was a system under which the producer obtained more for his milk than under the present system.
