Interspersed between the heats of the races will be our Vaudeville Program featuring ERIC THE GREAT, famed high pole artist whose amazing stunts 210 feet in the air have thrilled great audiences at some of the largest fairs in America and Europe.

CAPTAIN SOLOMON AND HIS DIVING CHAMPIONS will present a brilliant program of fancy and clown diving concluding with a spectacular 125 foot dive into a five foot tank in flames.

BONETTE AND SON, America's greatest balloonists and parachute jumpers will give a super-daring exhibition of sensational aeronautical feats, changing the parachute stunt each day. The Bonette Balloon act will be the concluding feature of each afternoon's program. The parachute jump will take place when the balloon has risen to about 4,000 feet in the air.

MARIE'S ANIMAL CIRCUS consists of three trainers and 20 performing animals—dogs, goats, monkeys and bear, in a fast program of clever balancing and juggling. A feature will be Flano, the wire-walking wonder dog. This is positively one of the best animal acts on tour today. SWIGGLE AND SWIGGLE, comedy jugglers in humorous antics that will provoke mirth and merriment.

THE CYCLING WHEELERS, in two acts. They use several types of wheels and do astounding things in their lightning spectacle of trick and comedy cycling. There will be no waits. Quite frequently Vaudeville and Horse Show will be going on at the same time, so that spectators can listen to one or watch either either one as they desire.

An additional act in connection with the evening program will be BONETTE'S SLIDE FOR LIFE, from a post attached to the top of the central grand stand, 60 feet high. He will slide by wire through the fiery furnace some 500 feet away. This will be the concluding act of the evening prior to the setting-off of the fireworks.

On or about ten o'clock the FIREWORKS will be set off and you will certainly say that this year's program is the best FIREWORKS display we have ever given.
