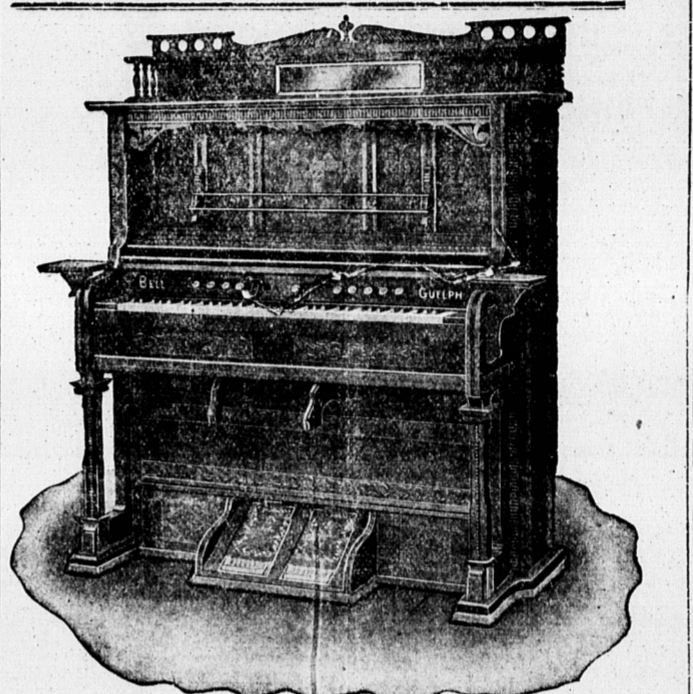
During seventeen years past "many millions over a billion dollars" have
