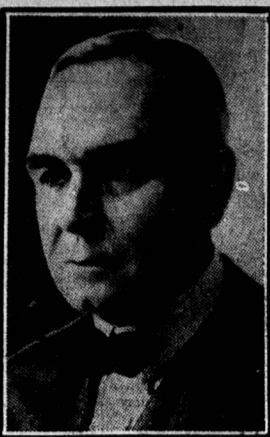

Large Attendance at Carleton Meeting

There was a large attendance at the meeting called for the purpose of urging upon the authorities the necessity of a new and up-to-date station at Carleton Siding.

Resolution re Carleton Station

1st. WHEREAS it has been brought to our attention by the Potato Shippers, Farmers, and General Merchants, of this vicinity, that the Station accommodation at Carleton Siding is inadequate, and totally unfit to accommodate the travelling public and the ever increasing volume of business at this Station.

2nd. THAT WHEREAS the outward and inward shipments at this Station is estimated at to be approximately as follows: Outward Shipments: Potatoes, 200 to 300 cars, eggs, 100 cases; live stock, pork, hides, etc., and other farm products in large quantities.

Inward Shipments: Fertilizer 23 cars; coal, 25 cars; feed, 3 to 4 cars, lumber 5 cars, general merchandise for 3 general stores, and it is estimated that these shipments will bring this station up among the ten best stations on the Island.

3rd. AND WHEREAS the improvements in siding facilities and the building of a loading ramp for potato shippers along with other improvements, recently put in by the Railway Management at Carleton, through Mr. T. B. Gillespie, P. E. Island Division is greatly appreciated by the people of this vicinity. We would further ask that this good work be completed, by placing at Carleton an up to date station with a competent caretaker, and a telephone for the accommodation of the public, using this station as their chief place of business, and shipping point.

4th. THEREFORE RESOLVED that this large and representative meeting, assembled in Cape Traverse Hall, on this 20th day of January, 1927, do hereby put themselves on record, that the following improvements be put into effect at this point as early a date as possible.

1st. That the present station be discarded and that a new building sufficiently commodious to take care of the ever increasing trade, both of outward, and inward freight be built at as early a date as possible.

2nd. That a Caretaker be placed in charge of a Station immediately in order to protect the shippers and prevent the great loss now being sustained by them especially, on incoming freight, and that this caretaker be paid a sufficient remuneration for the services that he is required to perform.

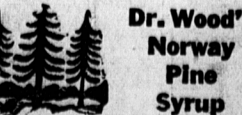
3rd. That the management immediately install a telephone in this station for the convenience of the shippers, a large number of whom are a long distance from the station, pending the putting into practice the further request that this station be made a regular booking station as soon as the business warrants same.

4. That in the opinion of this meeting, the station should be moved to the north side of the railway track, and east of the main road.

49,335 Canadians Entered U. S. in Last Six Months

WASHINGTON, Feb. 3. - During the last six months of 1926 a total of 49,335 persons emigrated from Canada to the United States, according to the report of immigration commissioner Hull made public tonight.

The outflow of aliens from the United States during the month of December, was announced as numbering 29,356, the largest departure of foreigners from the country in a single month since July, 1925.

BEACON FIRES FROM COAST TO COAST TO CELEBRATE DOMINION BIRTHDAY

Sixtieth Anniversary of Confederation will be Marked in City and Hamlet, town and Countryside - Prince of Wales Visit on This Occasion to be More of Official Tour Than His Recent Trips to Canada.

OTTAWA, Ont., Feb. 1. - Plans are rapidly maturing for the celebration of Canada Confederation's 60th birthday on July 1, of this year in Canada for part of the summer at least, and it is understood that this year's visit will be more in the nature of an official tour than any since his first coming to Canada in 1919.

The Government, working with the Association of Canadian Clubs, and indirectly with all the Canadian Clubs of the Dominion, is organizing for the celebration. An inter-departmental committee under the chairmanship of Dr. C. D. Skelton, under Secretary of State for External Affairs, is being formed to advise the Government and to make recommendations to the Canadian Clubs and other patriotic organizations.

The tentative plans call for field days, picnics, patriotic meetings, special instruction in the schools prior to Dominion Day, and sporting events of distinctly Canadian character. At noon on Dominion Day there will be salutes of guns and probably military displays during the afternoon. At night it is proposed to have fire works and 10,000 beacon fires reaching from the Atlantic to the Pacific in all the cities, towns and hamlets of Canada.

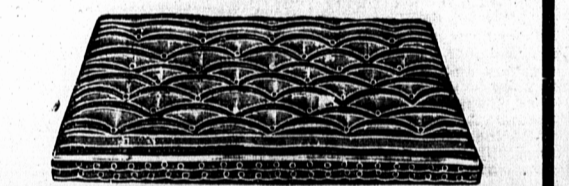

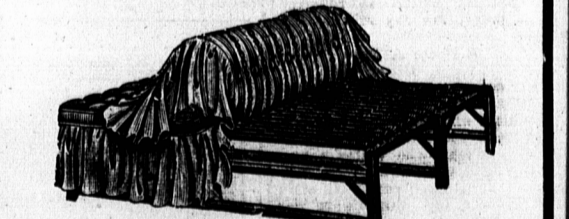
