ENGLAND'S NAVAL DEFENCE. LONDON, June 18.-Lord Charles Berosford in a letter to the papers strongly criticizes Britain's policy of reducing Britain's naval strength in the Mediterranean declaring it the principal link in the Empire's chain of defence. He urges that any weaken-

ing by Britain gives Germany greater strength in what are the world's strategic centres. The London Daily Express says today that the proposed changes in the Mediterranean will be abandoned because of forceful opposition from Kitchener and others and the former efficiency will be maintained.

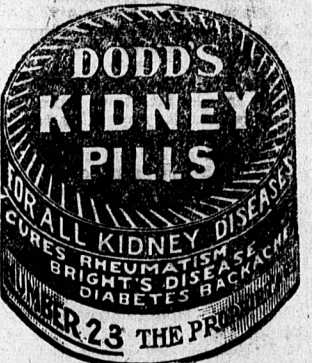
