IT PAYS to buy in this Province. **THE NORTHUMBERLAND.**—The Northumberland docked in Charlottetown last night at 8 o'clock.

QUEBEC S. S.—The S. S. Caspédia sailed from Montreal yesterday at 4 o'clock from Charlottetown and is due here on Monday night.

ENGINE DERAILED.—While engine No. 25 of the P. E. I. R. was running through the Railway yard yesterday afternoon she ran into an open switch, opposite the freight shed. Every wheel left the track. A number of men were immediately put to work, to put her on the rails and this was accomplished after a considerable time. Engine No. 10 took out the regular 3.45 p. m. train about 4.10 p. m.

WEDDING BELLS.—A pretty wedding was solemnized at the Baptist Parsonage at Hazelbrook on August 6th, when Mrs. Clara Lowther and Mr. George W. Rourke, both of Montague, were united in the bonds of holy matrimony. The ceremony was performed by the Rev. W. D. Wilson. The wedding dejeuner was served at the parsonage, and afterwards the happy couple drove to their future home in Montague.

ON REVENUE BUSINESS.—The D. G. revenue cruiser Laurentian arrived Charlottetown harbor on Wednesday night, being accompanied by the steam tender Albatros, which is also engaged in revenue work. Both craft came in here in order to coal and take in stores, having come from Quebec and being bound for Halifax. They are to engage in revenue cruising on the Nova Scotia coast in the vicinity of Halifax, and will leave Charlottetown to proceed to their destination this morning.

(From Yesterday's Evening Guardian) **CALLED BY DEATH.**—Mrs. John D. Lewis, who went to Athabasca Landing, Alta., some three months ago to visit, died there early Saturday morning from heart trouble after an illness of about two weeks says an Alberta Exchange. She was first attacked with stomach trouble which was later complicated by heart disease. Her condition was apparently improving and she was able to be about the house. When she was first stricken she sent for her children and at the time of her death most of her family was at her bed side. Isabella McCormick was born at Cardigan, Prince Edward Island in April 1859. She was married there in 1877 to John D. Lewis, who died six years ago. The family came to Grafton in the summer of 1881 and Mr Lewis engaged in lumber and contracting business with Charles Nollman. Mrs. Lewis was a devoted mother and a kind and loving wife. She was a devout member of the Catholic church during her life, and its sacraments and ministrations meant much to her. She is survived by eight children, Mrs. R. J. Flemming and Mrs. H. L. Hanson, of this city, Mrs. J. J. Kennedy, New York City, Mrs. William Gascell, Josephine, Thomas V., and George F. Lewis, of Athabasca Landing, Alta., and J. C. Louis, of Moose Jaw, Sask. The body was brought to Athabasca for burial Monday evening.

PASS ME ALONG.—Among the express goods by the Empress on Tuesday morning last was a curiosity in the shape of an umbrella of the Ancient times and worth about (four cents)? It was started on its way by the agent of the Wells-Fargo Express Company at Bartlett, Texas, on March 13th, 1913. He placed an express tag on it with the following instructions: "I am not worth much but I like to be moving, so tag me and send me along, but return me soon." From Texas it moved through California, being in Sacramento on April 2, since which time it has passed through twelve different States and in Canada has travelled through Quebec, New Brunswick, Cape Breton, Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island, arriving in Charlottetown on the ninth and leaving again on the twelfth. At each stop it was tagged by the express agent and these tags, 104 in all, contain the name and date of the office and in some cases additional instructions or remarks; the Island's tags also included several prospectuses of fox companies. The trip of this curiosity still continues and may, before it again reaches its starting place, make another call at the Island, as it has done at several other places.—J.

BEFF TEA LEADS TO ALCOHOLIC POISONING. LONDON, Aug. 14.—Liverpool physicians are interested in the case of a travelling salesman who, although a teetotaler, shows every sign of alcoholic poisoning. The man's illness is ascribed to the excessive drinking of beef tea and other meat extracts, and the physicians believe that this indicates that nitrogenous stimulants have an effect on the system similar to that of alcohol.

RIFLE COMPETITIONS.—On Monday next, two shooting fixtures will take place in Charlottetown on the Kensington Rifle Range, commencing promptly at two o'clock. One event will be for tyro shots, who will compete for the Ferris Trophy, while in the other case the older members of the Civilian Rifle Club will shoot for the beautiful silver salver and Brown Cup. Both of these matches will be shot over the 200, 500 and 600 yds. ranges, and will take place concurrently. The shooting will take place, rain or shine. No doubt, with the glamour of the annual prize meeting still on them, riflemen will turn out in large numbers for these events.

CRIMEAN VETERAN DISAPPEARS AFTER STRANGE REQUEST. MALDEN, Mass., Aug. 14.—Edward Power, a 98-year-old veteran of the Crimean War, placed an order with a stone cutter here yesterday to have his name chiselled on a stone beside that of his dead wife. To-day he was reported missing, and no trace of him could be found by the police of surrounding cities. Mr. Power was one of the officers of the British Veteran Society at Halifax, N. S.
