BOSTON WANTS BAD CHECK MAN

HALIFAX, June 4 - Robert Wilson who pleaded guilty to the charge of unlawfully using forged checks was again before the police court on a similar charge yesterday.

SINGING HEN AMAZES PEOPLE

LIBERTY, Pa., June 2 - Miss May Frick's Rhode Island hen, "Queen Ann," known for miles around as the singing hen, burst into song in front of the Methodist Church and so amazed the worshippers that the services were suspended temporarily.

One of the informations sworn by Detective Hanrahan, who arrested the two forgers at Truro, recites that Robert Wilson, knowing that a certain cheque, dated at Halifax, May 20th, 1907, payable to E. Wilson for the sum of \$4.00, drawn on the Canadian Bank of Commerce, Halifax branch, purporting to be signed by William Horton, to be forged, did unlawfully use the same as if the said cheque were genuine, by uttering the same to one George Hubley.

The accused paid this bogus cheque to Mrs. Hubley for a week's board. Another charge was also laid against Wilson for uttering a forged cheque for the amount of eight dollars on Mr. Walker, a clothier, Upper Water street. The accused got a pair of pants and overalls and some change for the bogus cheque.

Some weeks ago the chief of police issued a warning to Halifax people to look out for an utterer of forged cheques, who was supposed to be in Nova Scotia. The Halifax paper published the announcement with the description of the man that the Boston police were looking for. It now turns out that the man who was committed for trial by the stipendiary magistrate today is the individual who worked a number of forged cheques of on merchants in Boston.
