Refugees Burned In Russian Barracks

BERLIN, April 4.—(A.P.)—A Warsaw dispatch to the newspaper Vossington said today that 70 prisoners were killed in a wild panic when the wooden barracks of a Russian Camp at Krakja caught fire.

Confined in the barracks, the dispatch said, were 150 fugitives caught while attempting to cross the Polish-Latvian border. Guards were afraid to open the doors in the absence of a superior officer, it was added, and the panic-stricken prisoners trampled and crushed each other in vainly trying to escape through the barred windows.
