Held in Their Rooms Last Night--The Railway Site and Extension of Rails Considered--Thanks to Ministers for Improved Railway Service.

Desperate Fighting Reported--Russian Turning Movement Checked--Japs Hold Their Own and Advance--Positions of the Two Armies--Jap Shells at Port Arthur Severely Damage a Russian Battleship.

BATTLE GOING ON. TOKIO, Oct. 12--[Special]--The battle which began on Tuesday continued today but the results were not decisive. TURNING MOVEMENT CHECKED. The Russians are in strong force on the Japanese right but it is believed the Japs have checked the Russian turning movement.

CHATHAM STEAMER SUNK WITH EIGHTEEN

The Story Says that Mr. Fagar, One of the Owners, Lost All His Money and a Son in the Disaster at New London, P. E. I.

This is the foundation of a story that has circulated throughout the leading Canadian papers and was referred to in The Guardian yesterday. The following is taken from the Montreal Transcript. The steamer Chatham, owned by Mr. Fagar, was on her way from New London, P. E. Island, on Saturday night, Oct. 9, when she was sunk by a mine.

An American captain, and was no insured for a cent. Besides the captain, there was a crew of eighteen men, most of them married with families depending upon them for support. Mr. Fagar had invested in the newly built steamer about every dollar he owned in the world, about \$18,000. The steamer was bound from Tracadie, P. E. Island, to New London, and during the night of Saturday night, sank with her entire crew when nearing the port to which she was bound.

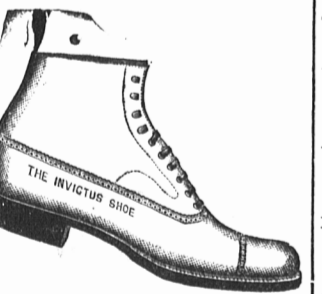
