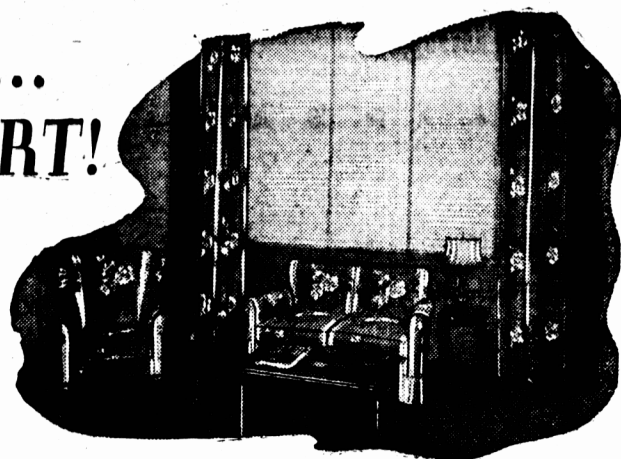

C.N.R. Freight Shed At Moncton Enlarged

MONCTON, N. B. Nov 24 —To facilitate the handling of less-than-carload lot freight shipments for distribution to all sections of the Maritime Provinces, T. L. Landers, chief engineer of the Atlantic region, Canadian National Railways, has announced the construction of a large, new extension to the present transfer and freight shed here. The work is scheduled to commence within the next few days and will be done by the company's own bridge and building department. When the original building was constructed in 1920, the average monthly tonnage of lot (less than carload lot) freight was 4,000 tons. Today this has increased more than four times, and the average monthly tonnage of lot freight is the fourth largest centre on the entire Canadian National Railways system.

as possible next year. We have a gigantic paving program to put into effect just as soon as it is possible to start next spring.

Of Mutual Benefit

The paving of these roads certainly will mean that our farmers will not have to contend with muddy roads in spring and late fall. Then too, with the snow fighting equipment which the Liberal Government has acquired, these roads will be opened to Charlottetown twelve months a year. Ladies and gentlemen, you know what this means, both to our farmers and to ourselves.

We in Charlottetown must admit that at our businesses are dependent on the farmers of the Province and the opening of these roads open to traffic in winter must tend to an increase in our business. There is no mention whatever in the Conservative platform, that one foot of pavement will be laid in 1948.

Ladies and gentlemen, in this post-war period, let us not regard these things as luxuries. We must see to it that Charlottetown receives the assistance which is rightly hers. I have in mind three sources of revenue to our Province in which Charlottetown should certainly share.

First, I believe that a portion of the gasoline tax of this Province should be paid to this city in proportion to the amount of gasoline consumption. I believe if this was done, then the municipal tax of \$12.25 on automobiles could be abolished. This in itself would be quite a saving to the individual truck and car owner. A portion of the tax on the sale of motor vehicles should be paid to the Province for the maintenance of highways rightfully belongs to Charlottetown and the Province.

Secondly, I feel that a percentage of the health tax should be paid to this city, to be spent at the discretion of the City Council to provide treatment and hospitalization for the poor and needy of this city, and also to further increase the grants payable to our city hospitals. Certainly by far the larger portion of this tax is paid by the residents of Charlottetown.

Thirdly, I shall endeavor to further the claims of our City Council in respect to the receiving their just proportion of tax on Dominion Government properties in this city.

Of Prime Importance

I believe these are three matters of prime importance to the residents of Charlottetown — matters in which every citizen should be interested, and which, I know, will receive recognition by the Liberal Government after the 11th day of December. These items represent large sums of money which definitely should be given our city.

To my good friends in the Royal City — I know the trouble you have had with your water supply. Our Government made a survey last year and you know its findings. I feel that our Government could either negotiate with the Dominion Government to have the supply to have these areas given pipe lines from the mains running to the city, or better still, a Government reservoir owned and operated which would supply water to you at a flat rate. I believe, too, that with the beautiful homes now in proximity to this city, the paving of the streets and laying of sidewalks should be included in the paving program which will be inaugurated next summer.

With the rural electrification program fastly being put into effect, the streets in Spring Park, Gaytown and St. Avaris should be lighted. I believe this should be one of the first things done. With these populated areas so close to Charlottetown it is absolutely essential that our Government give this matter their earliest attention. As your representative I will endeavor to have this project started as soon as possible.

City Waterfront

Ladies and gentlemen, I know our waterfront is in a state of disrepair. I know that whereas the responsibility of the Dominion Government. I know also that the recommendations of the Provincial Government to the Dominion Government are acted upon. I know that sites for new industries are necessary if they are to locate in Charlottetown. I know that, with the erection of a waterfront from the head of L.M. Poole's wharf to the Railway wharf, much land could be reclaimed. If elected, as a member of our Liberal Government on December 11th, I will endeavor to have these claims recognized. I know that a new waterfront has been sought before. I know our Board of Trade and City Council have pushed for this in the past. I assure them, if elected, our Provincial Government will demand that these claims be recognized.

In this period of reconstruction whether or not we enter a period of depression such as followed the last war is entirely in the hands of your governments, both Dominion and Provincial. I maintain that to insure against such a condition is to vote for the party that is now in power.

Ladies and gentlemen — as you know, I have been a member of the City Council for the last eighteen years, and I have always prided myself in that I have been the advocate of labour in our city and Council. In all my years of service at the Council board have I refused any demands made on me by the laboring men of this city. Twice in the last five years have secured wage increases of 15 cents per hour. I still maintain

that the wages paid labor in our city are in sufficient to meet the high costs of living.

Industries Required

Then too, I feel that to provide employment for labor, we must encourage industry to this Province — industry that will employ labor and pay labor a living wage — not for a few months in the summer, but for twelve months a year. These are things that must be done by the government of this Province if we are to avoid unemployment. Many of our veterans are

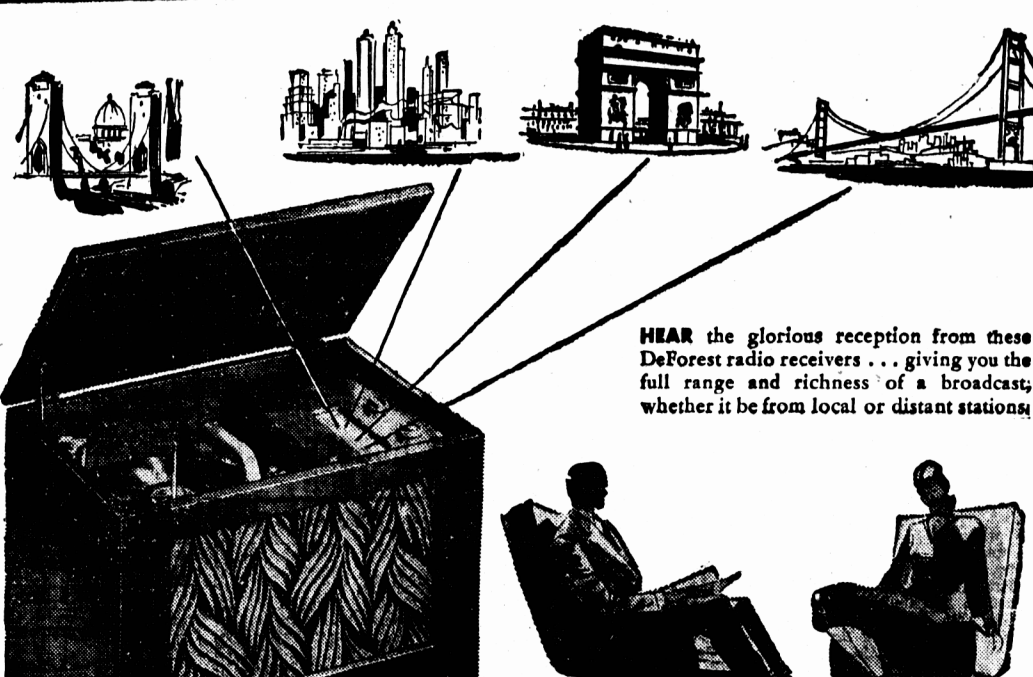
still unemployed. They must be rehabilitated, and labor must definitely be given its place with adequate rates of pay. Ladies and gentlemen, as I have said before, in the eighteen years I have been in civic politics, I have always been the friend of labor and if elected on December 11th, I will still work to the best of my ability to see that labor gets its rightful place — the right to live, not merely exist. The same to look to the future is now, not when the crisis are upon us. Unemployment is a word too familiar today. Let us see to it that steps are taken to insure work for all. Only by providing adequate work and fair wages for all can we expect to live in harmony with one another, and arrive at the era when not only unemployment will be a thing of the past, but strikes, which after all are the only means by which labour can assert itself, will be unheard of.
