I would like to make reference to the kindness of the Government and the Leader of the Opposition for their kind words and generous treatment of me last session. I was prevented by reason over which I had no control, much as I would like to have been there. I shall now have to retire from the House; but I feel that a kind Providence may permit me to take my seat here before the session closes.

PLY TO SPEECH CARRIED. The motion for the address in reply to the Speech from the Throne was then put to the House and carried unanimously.

HON. MR. STEWART then moved that the address be engrossed and that it be presented to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor by the whole House. These motions were carried. HON. MR. ARSENAULT, as chairman of the committee on private bills, reported as follows: "Your committee on private bills having had under consideration the following bills, report that the said bills are of a private nature and recommended the payment of the fees set opposite the same respectively:—an act to incorporate the Bonanza Fox Breeding Co., Ltd., \$100; an act to allow Goshen Elijah Luther Howie McArthur to change his name to that of George Howard McArthur."

\$10; an act to incorporate the Prince Edward Silver Black Fox Co., Ltd., \$175; an act to incorporate The Columbia Silver Black Fox Co., \$65; The Milton Silver Patch Fox Co., Ltd., \$45; and an act to amend the act to incorporate the George B. Brown Fur Farming Co., Ltd., \$70." On the motions of Hon. Mr. Arsenault, this report was concurred in and the bills were read a second time.

Wednesday, March 18, 1914. On the resumption of the House today Mr. A. P. Prowse presented a petition asking for the amendment of an act of incorporation of the "Dominion Fox Breeding Co., Ltd.," the amendment involving an increase of the capital from \$20,000 to \$150,000. The petition was referred to a committee of three to be reported. Next was presented a petition by Mr. Prowse for an act to incorporate the "Orchard Black Silver and Cross Fox Ranching Co., Ltd." This petition was also referred to a committee of three. There were no questions by members, and the reports of committees were proceeded with.

The Hon. Mr. Stewart moved, and the Hon. Mr. Arsenault seconded, a resolution to repeal the 42nd, Victoria Cap 17 and to give power to the Lieutenant Governor in Council by a commission to appoint a commissioner or commissioners to enquire into any matter connected with the good government of this Province or the conduct of any part of the public business thereof with all necessary powers to procure the attendance of accountants, technical advisers, clerks, reporters and witnesses and to provision to permit any person to be charged to be represented by counsel and that leave be given to introduce a Bill founded on said resolution." The bill was read a first time. The report of the Committee, (Chairman Mr. Dobie) appointed to consider the petition of Goshen Elijah Luther Howie McArthur to change his name to that of George Howard McArthur, was adopted.

A committee of the whole House (Chairman Mr. Buntain) was appointed to consider a bill (read a second time) for the incorporation of the Bonanza Fox Co., Ltd. Their report was adopted. The report was also adopted of the Committee (Chairman, Mr. Myers) which considered the bill for incorporation of the Columbia Silver Black Fox Co., Ltd. The bill was passed for third reading.

The bill for incorporation of the "George D. Brown Fur Farming Co., Ltd., was considered by a Committee of the House (Chairman, Mr. Buntain.) It was passed for third reading.

The next bill considered was one for incorporation of the "Prince Edward Silver Black Fox Co., Ltd." It was dealt with by a committee of the House (Chairman, Mr. Dobie). The bill was read clause by clause. The speaker took exception to the name "Prince Edward" and read to the House the following communication received by His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor from Ottawa: "Restriction of the terms 'Royal,' 'Imperial,' 'Crown,' 'Queen,' Dept. Secty. of State of Canada, Ottawa.

The Lieut.-Governor, Prince Edward Island. Sir,—Adverting to my despatch of the 18th, ultimo, I have now the honour to acquaint you that His Excellency the Governor General has received a further communication from the Secretary of State for the Colonies on the subject of the use of the term "Imperial" and words of similar import in forming part of the designation of companies, incorporated by Government. From this despatch it appears that in future the latitude hitherto allowed by the Secretary of State for Home Affairs in the United Kingdom in this respect will be restricted; that is to say that the use of the term "Imperial" and other titles signifying Royal or Government support or patronage such as "Crown," "King's," "Queen's," etc., shall not be allowed unless there is some real or Imperial or Crown connection which gives a well-founded claim of recognition, and unless it can be shown that there is a long and bona fide user and that the name so used is not to convey any suggestion of Government support or patronage.

"The Secretary of State of Canada concurs in these proposed regulations, which in future will be applied to the issue of letters patent by him. "I am to request that Your Honour would be so good as to bring this despatch to the attention of your ministers and to suggest that they also be invited to limit the use of the terms "Royal," "Imperial," etc. to conform to the regulations which in future will obtain in the United Kingdom and at Ottawa. I have the Honour to be, Sir, Your Obedient Servant. (Signed) J. POPE, Under-Secty. of State."

The name was changed and that of the "Prince Albert" substituted for the "Milton Silver Patch Fox Co., Ltd.," was passed for a third reading. The House hereafter adjourned until 3 p. m. tomorrow.

THE WEATHER, THE TEMPERATURE, TIDE, MOON, ETC.

(Special to The Guardian) TORONTO, March 19.—Gales shifting to westerly and northerly with rain; cloudy at night with snow and a change to colder.

THE WEATHER.—Yesterday was beautifully mild and springlike, continuing mild and clear at night. The thermometer at the meteorological station registered as high as 42 degrees above zero—a very moderate temperature. The lowest recorded during the day was 35 above, which was at nine p. m. At nine a. m. it was two degrees higher than this, 37 above. On the previous night the lowest was 34 above. The tide will be high this afternoon at 3.41 and tomorrow at 4.48; it will be high tomorrow morning at 6.01 and Saturday at 7.22. The sun sets this evening at 6.11 and tomorrow at 6.13; it rises tomorrow morning at 6.02 and Saturday at 6. The moon sets tomorrow morning at 3.40. The last quarter of the moon was on Wednesday, March 18, at 3.33 p. m.
