WHY BRITISH ELECTIONS ARE NOT SIMULTANEOUS.

Long ago the question of simultaneous elections was fought and won in Canada. Under the old order of things the Government could and did bring on the elections first in constituencies that were favorable to its policy, and later in those ridings that were opposed.

officer must fix the day of nomination not later than the ninth day after he receives the writ, with three clear days between the day on which he gives notice and the day of nomination. Polling may be not less than two nor more than six days after nomination.

This matter appears not to have aroused much attention in the Mother Country. There the elections are held on different days, extending over some two weeks, but this is the result of an automatic process which gives the Government no advantage.

With the dissolution on January 10 an election in London might be held anywhere between the 15th and 19th, and in the more distant counties between the 19th and 29th. But the Government reaps no advantage from this, as the returning officers are mostly the sheriffs, and, as we have said, non-partisan officials.

CANADA'S RECORD BREAKING FIELD CROPS.

Canadian farmers in 1909 cultivated two and a half million acres more than last year and raised field crops worth in local markets \$532,992,100. It was a half billion dollar crop with something over for good measure, and exceeded the crop of 1908 in value by a hundred million dollars.

potatoes, turnips, roots, corn and beans 84 millions. So the millions were rolled up. Nova Scotian field crops were worth 22 millions, New Brunswick's 18 millions, Prince Edward Island's 9 millions. In proportion to area and population alike Prince Edward Island leads Eastern Canada in field crops.

Wheat, oats and barley produced here worth 263 millions; hay and clover 132 millions; rye, peas, buckwheat and mixed grains 26 millions;

Canada's field crops were equal to \$76 per head or \$380 per family of her seven millions of people. In this Province the crops were worth \$90 per head or \$450 per family. Good.

In Canada there are 22 organizations for fighting tuberculosis. In New Jersey there are 42, in New York 110 and in Pennsylvania 150. The total gross debt of Canada now comes pretty close to the half billion mark. On November 30 it was \$499,732,113. Against this there are assets set down at once 176 millions, leaving a net debt of 323 millions.

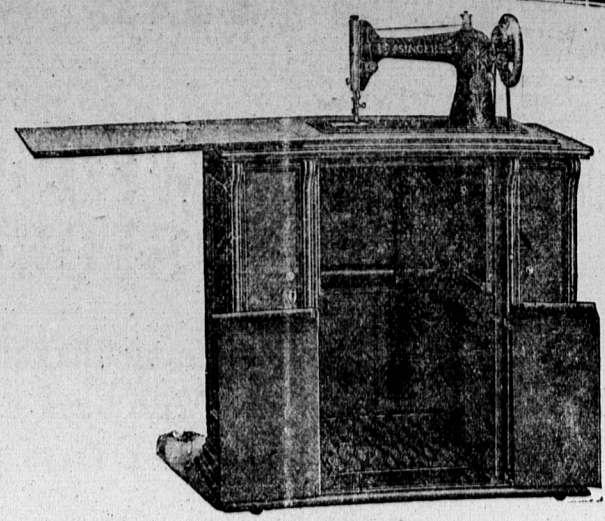

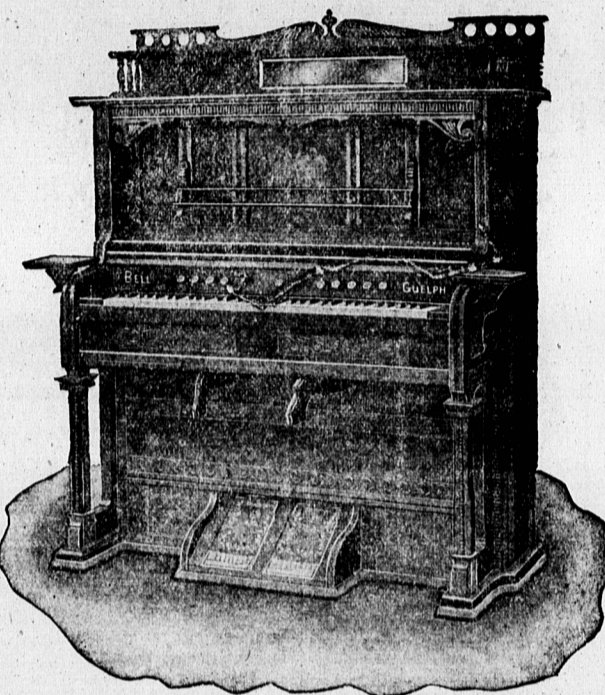
