### AMBIDEXTERITY AMONG CHILDREN IS URGED NOW

If children are to be successful in life, they ought according to the latest theory from German scientists, to be taught to use both hands equally and be trained to be ambidextrous. Then, it is said, their brains will be of better quality than if they are "right handed," or "left handed" only.

Scientific men in England are also quite agreed upon this, and while they have advocated this theory to educators of the young time and again, England is waiting for a lead.

"If a man who is not ambidextrous attempts, say, to write with the left hand, he will immediately find how unused to that sort of work the right hand side of his brain is," said a medical man who believes in ambidexterity, when asked his views on the theory.

When he tries to do with his left hand work to which that hand is unaccustomed, he will find the same thing. That is he will discover that he seldom consciously uses one-half of his brain, and nearly always uses the other half.

"I know a very famous surgeon who has not only trained himself to operate with both hands equally well, but also to write with one hand and draw or paint with the other. ### WARSHIP TO BEAR THE NAME OF THE KING

not new to the navy, but they were first introduced to commemorate people of distinction and title.

"It is, however, in regard to small craft that greater diversity of opinion prevails. Objections and protests are constantly made to the use of such names as Dove, Violet, Stag, Zepher and Grasshopper for fighting ships, especially as they have no connection with maritime affairs or the navy. The suggestion has been made more than once to substitute for these botanical, geological and estomological names those of naval officers who have distinguished themselves by gallantry in action.

"This would again be to follow the American rule, which gives to destroyers the names of naval officers, a practice, moreover, which obtains in several of the European fleets. The American plan, however, appears to be open to this objection that no distinction is made between officers of different grades, no baptismal names are given in the usual lists, and the principle of discrimination is not clear. Thus there are, among the names of small craft, Farragut and Decatur, of a rank and distinction which in the British navy have been honored by a battle ship or big cruiser; Cushing and Flusser, whose exploits are well known, and Shubrick and Smith, names which must be puzzling, because of their frequency, to any one not intimately acquainted with American naval history.

went down. The injury seemed to cause only temporary inconvenience, though it was deemed wise to declare Akar out of his engagements at different meetings. In both the Great Western and Grand Circuits, Akar is one of the fastest and best gaited pacers yet seen in Virginia, and he has good manners, too. At the Virginia State Fair this Fall, he captured the blue ribbon for the best stallion and also carried off the gold medal in another class, while his yearling son was first in the class offered for youngsters of his age. Pavetta, dam of Akar, has also produced Khaki (3) (2.29), Utatlan (2.21), and Binetta, by Bingara, son of Bingan (2.061), who was last year in her two-year-old form, while during the early part of the present season she trotted a trial in 2.15 for David Shaw, owner of Joan (2.04), and was then turned out.

The fast pacer Akar is a half brother of the trotting stallion Aquiri, owned by J. M. Nicholson of this City.

### STEAMER "COTTAGE CITY" ON VALDEZ ISLAND.

VANCOUVER, Jan. 27—The steamer "Cottage City," from Seattle for Skagway, struck Valdez Island in the Gulf of Georgia. She was one hundred miles north of Vancouver when she struck. Presumably she was in a snowstorm. Shortly after the accident occurred she was reported by the Point Grey wireless station and a second message came, saying: "All safe, going in boats."

Apparently the vessel was a hopeless wreck, and the crew and passengers, getting in the boats, were going ashore. The sea was calm and no anxiety is felt for the safety of the passengers.

There must be fifty on board, chiefly Seattle people. The "Cottage City" is a wooden vessel and pretty old.
