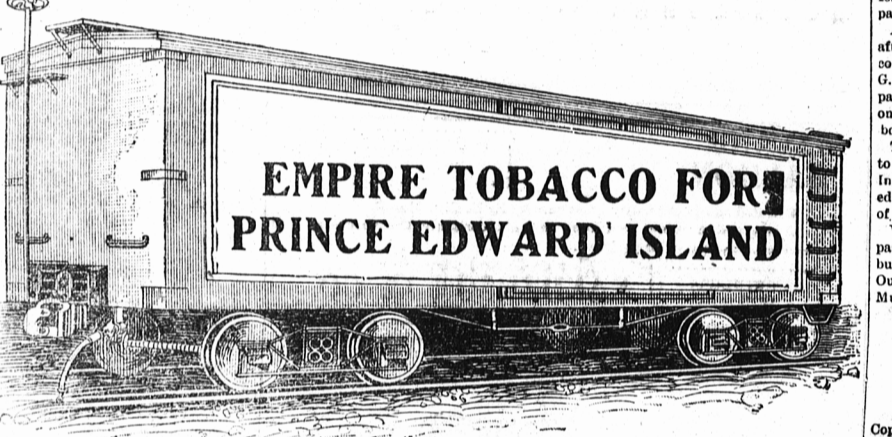

A RECORD SHIPMENT

This Special Train Has Left St. Thomas With 1,211,351 Lbs. of Canadian Leaf.

A week ago last Saturday a new record was made on the C. P. R. in the largest shipment of tobacco leaf ever made in Canada. A special train of thirty-one (31) cars, all laden with the fragrant leaf, was made up in St. Thomas, Ont., for shipment to Granby, Que.
