St. Eleanor's with the following:—"A number of members assembled at the residence of Bro. R. H. McDonald, of St. Eleanor's recently, to present him with a congratulatory address as the first Forester on Prince Edward Island, having attained the age of seventy years. 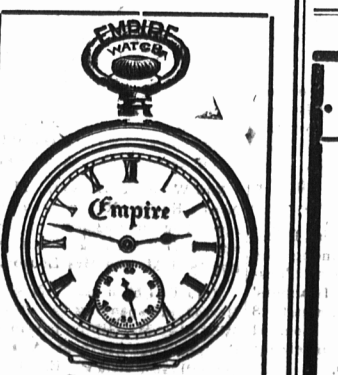
