More Sunshine
Needed For Crops

OTTAWA, June 29 (CP)—The Dominion Bureau of Statistics reported today that warmer weather during the past week stimulated the growth of crops in all parts of Canada but there is still a need for sunshine and heat in most sections.

Seeding is not yet completed in the Maritime Provinces but good progress was made the past week and recent fine weather has also improved the crop prospects the report said. Potato planting is proceeding apace. Growth of pastures is improving but clover stands are below average in Prince Edward Island and timothy fields are thin. The hay crop looks promising on the whole.

Some seeding remains to be done in Quebec. Weather has been very variable during the past two weeks but in the last seven days all crops made progress during a spell of fine, warm weather. Having it row under way. The condition of meadows and pastures is excellent and a good milk flow seems assured. Weed growth has been heavy as the result of rains and insects seem to be more prevalent than usual.
