CERVERA IN POLITICS.

Abandons the Navy for Civil Duties.
 WASHINGTON, D. C., Oct. 12, 1898. Admiral Cervera has written an open letter accepting the nomination which has been tendered him to represent the district of Ferrol as senator in the Spanish Cortes. The letter is an interesting document, for in it he takes occasion to outline what will be his future policy as a senator, and announces that he will resign his commission as an admiral in the Spanish navy, preferring to spend the remainder of his life as a civilian, believing that, by assisting in making better laws for Spain, he can better advance the interests of the Spanish people, whom he desires to serve.

In his letter, Admiral Cervera says that he has learned much that will be of interest to Spain, during the war between his country and the United States, and especially while he was a prisoner in the enemy's country. He speaks highly of the kindness shown him and his officers and men by the American people, and of their generosity. Spain, he says, should learn many lessons by this war, chief among them being that a change of methods in the conduct of governmental affairs, in fact, a change of policy internally and externally, is what is most desired to advance the cause of Spain. He declares that Spain is living too much in the past, and that she must develop her latent powers, and again achieve her position at the head of all nations.

He declares that it will be his purpose as a member of the Cortes to advocate such measures as will bring about a reformation of the policy of the government, and that with many things Spaniards can well pattern after the Americans. He advises that Spaniards should soon forget this war, and make haste to become again friends with the Americans.

In many quarters Admiral Cervera has been strongly censured by his countrymen since his return to Spain for his expressions of friendliness toward the Americans, but, nevertheless, he has a strong following, and, by his frankness and sincerity, has created among a large number of people a different impression regarding Americans than was ever possessed before, even by Cervera himself.

American Battleships On the Move After Active Service - The Chamberlains Leave For England.

"Better prices," say the bulls.

HALIFAX, October 10.—Friends of wheat in looking over the situation from a supply and demand standpoint, says a Montreal paper, contend that the position is a strong one, justifying in the long run a higher level of prices than those now prevailing. Among other things, attention is directed to the European outlook. According to Broomhall's latest estimate the European crop this year figures up 1,384,000,000 against 1,148,500,000 bushels last year. The requirements, however, according to the August report of the American agricultural bureau recognized as an authority everywhere, are 1,553,500,000 bushels, indicating therefore a shortage of 169,000,000 bushels in Europe. In making provisions for this deficiency the trade is forced to supplement the American and Russian big crops by estimator of similar increases in India and the Argentine, Australia and Africa. The inconsistency, if not actual folly, of this is seen in the fact that some of these crops will not be harvested before January of next year, and others are barely in the ground, making estimates of yield, therefore, a matter of the wildest kind of guesswork. According to Broomhall, the prospective increase of crops this year in the countries last named aggregates 49,000,000 bushels. With Russia proper estimated to have a crop 3,000,000 bushels larger than last year, suffering from famine in many interior provinces and subject to conflicting reports as to its actual yield, the bull theory is that unless other countries meet in every respect the liberal figures accorded to them America will have to supply the bulk of European needs for the next four or five months, particularly as the rye crop of Europe, usually drawn upon heavily in times of wheat scarcity is this year considerably below the average.
