Summary of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations

The sole head of a family or any male over eighteen years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency near in person at the District Office. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency, but not Sub-Agency on certain conditions. Entry—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. Homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 50 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section along side his homestead. Price \$5.00 per acre. Duties—Six months residence in each of three years after entering homestead patent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions. An settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Six months residence in each of three years cultivate 50 acres and erect a house worth \$500. The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough scrubby or stony land. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions. W. W. REPORT OF MONTAGUE WOMEN'S INSTITUTE

In reporting the work of our Institute it is difficult to separate it from the Red Cross work which we have done, both societies being under the same President and Secretary though the funds were kept separate.

There were twelve monthly meetings held, at five of these Miss MacFarlane was present and gave us demonstrations in Frozen desserts, Canning fruits and vegetables, pastry making etc. Miss Stierns was present at the annual meeting, and was most helpful in her advice and suggestions. Our society enjoyed extremely and benefited greatly by the visits of these two ladies. We also had one demonstration in Dry Cleaning by Miss Rhonda Wright, recently returned from Macdonald College.

Our principal interest this year has centred around the school but we have not made as much progress along this line as we would wish, as it seems difficult to arouse the interest of the community, but for the sake of seeing what could be done we undertook to put the vice-principal's room in as thorough a condition as the funds we had would permit. Therefore during the Xmas holidays, we had the room scrubbed and cleaned, had the walls and wood-work painted, the desks varnished, the floor oiled, and the black-board re-painted. We would have liked to have put in another window but owing to the construction of the building were unable to do so. Several of our members attended the annual school meeting, and suggested that the janitor's work could be improved, and that other rooms needed attention before the pupils returned in the autumn, and we trust that our suggestions are bearing fruit.
