Your Child in School

No. 17: Play is Educative.

Perhaps the most common characteristic of all children is their tendency for action of all kinds. The observation of children of preschool age impresses one with the fact that they come very near illustrating perpetual motion.

Since all of the experiences of the child, whether at play or at work, contribute to his education and the development of his character, the element of play can not be omitted from consideration in the establishment of a program of education.

The old notion that play was something to be tolerated must be abandoned. If play is educative, then both the teacher and the parent must be concerned with the play of children.

Children play for the satisfaction which they get from the play itself. Children perform their school work, as contrasted with play, in order to achieve certain results which they are prompted to feel are worthwhile.

The kindergarten is an example of how the educator is utilizing this play instinct. In the kindergarten the play instinct can be given free rein because of the age of the child.

It is one of the important functions of the teacher to assist in organizing the play of young children. Games must be taught and the teachers should be generally helpful in assisting children to play the games.

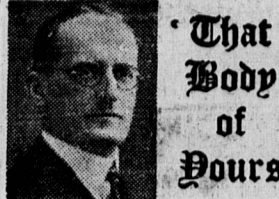

COMMON SENSE REGARDING BROKEN BONES

With the advent of the cooler weather and outdoor sports, broken bones are likely to be more frequent. It is only a few years back since a physician felt it his duty to examine an injury and immediately announce to the patient and the patient's family that the injury was a broken bone, a dislocated joint, or a bad sprain.

Now a dislocation is not usually hard to diagnose and immediate treatment is of course necessary, because if the bones remain out of place too long, the patient may develop a "joint" that is easy to dislocate.

However, in the case of sprain or a break the first thought should always be an X ray. This should be done before any extensive examination is made by the doctor.

When the doctor attempts to rub the edges together to hear the grating sound he may displace the edges of the bone, and what was just a simple "crack" across the joint, may become a real bad break because he had moved the broken edges of the bone away from one another, and they will have to be put back into place again when the X ray is taken.

Therefore don't think of your doctor as being afraid to make a decision as to whether or not a break has occurred, because he asks you to have an X ray examination before he decides definitely as to the trouble. He sometimes omits to have an X ray examination because he wants to spare you the expense, but in these days of workmen's compensation and so forth, it is only good sense and good judgment to submit to an X ray examination in case of injury.
