RECLUSE'S ESTATE

IS \$136,000 SHORT.

BROOKTON, Feb. 13—The death-
bed will of Horace Williams Howard,
who lived the 17 years after his
wife's death as a recluse in Provi-
dence, provides for \$61,000 in be-
quests, but the estate as appraised
when the will was returned in Ply-
mouth today amounts to only \$25,
000. It is thought that possibly a
strong box which has been mentioned,
but which has not been found, may
disclose the remainder of the dead-
man's estate. Fall but \$50,000 was
left to charity. Mrs. Sarah J. Burns
of this city is executrix. Mrs. Maria
H. Goward of South Eastern, a sis-
ter of the testator, it is said, will
make sensational disclosures when
the hearing in her contest is held
early in March.

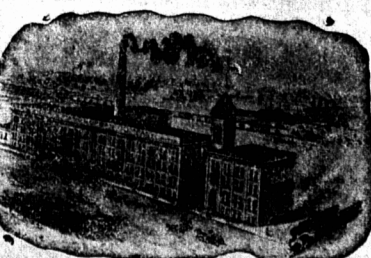

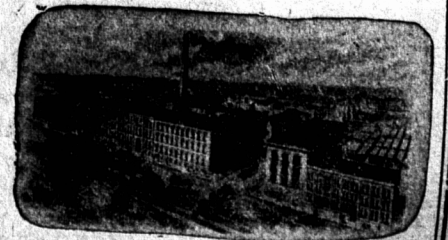
