REVOLUTIONISTS MUST FIGHT ON BEACH

PUERTO, Honduras, Feb. 1.—Although the actual position of the Revolutionists, under General Bonilla, is not known, there is a general feeling that they are gathering their forces together for an attack upon Puerto Cortez. It is believed also, that Bonilla will take the town without bloodshed as the Governor has already asked the commanders of the International Forces for 48 hours in which to evacuate the town. This request has been granted, and if the Government troops decide to withdraw, they will do so under the protection of the international Forces.

On Monday the Collier Caesar, un- dispatched with orders to inform the Revolutionists that fighting would be permitted only on the beach at Caballos Point, and that they would not be permitted to enter the town from the north by the trail or from the east by the railroad. The Caesar, however, was unable to find the Revolutionists.

For the purpose of carrying out the guarantee of protection, should the city be evacuated, the United States Gunboat Marietta and the British cruiser Brilliant have landed forces numbering about 200 men. The United States Cruiser Tacoma landed seventy men several days ago, and it is believed that this will be a sufficient force to control the situation.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 31.—In response to an appeal from Commander Cooper, of the U. S. gun boat Marietta, for the assistance of the Red Cross Society to relieve the distressed conditions of the wounded in the Honduras Revolution, the Secretary of the Navy has asked the officer to specify the extent of the aid needed. No reply has yet been received.

It is said that the wounded are in pitiful circumstances, and in dire need of assistance. Commander Cooper, it is assumed, will render all the aid possible through the surgeons on the American gun boats in Honduran waters. There is one surgeon and five or six members of the Hospital Corps on each of the vessels.

FIRE INSURANCE AND CREDIT.

Canadian Credit Men's Association Issues Educational Booklet regarding this All-important Matter.

In pursuance of its announced intention of impressing upon retailers the importance of adequate fire insurance protection, the Canadian Credit Men's Association, of Winnipeg, has issued a concise educational booklet. The following points made by Secretary Henry Detchen are well put, and well worth conning by all property holders and business men. It is not only the country store-keeper that needs "jogging up" along these lines.

Does Fire Insurance Pay? Yes! Why? Because without it you may some day find yourself in a position where you owe a lot of money without the money to pay it.

Because by keeping fully insured you are protecting yourself and possibly your family from losing the earnings of a life time.

Because it strengthens your position in the eyes of the men from whom you are buying goods. No one can afford to sell you on time if you are not properly insured.

Therefore no thorough business man should be without fire insurance.

Because you are careful on your own premises, is no guarantee that you may not be burned out by the spreading of an adjoining fire.

Are You Properly Insured?

1. Are the insuring companies financially responsible and in a position to pay all just claims?
2. Are you sufficiently insured at all times?
3. Remember your stock is much greater at one time of the year than at another. Do you regulate the amount of your insurance accordingly?
4. Are your buildings and contents properly described in the policy, and if more than one policy, do they all read the same? Make your description as brief as possible.

Can you prove the amount of your loss?
