A telegram to Mr. Nelson Rattenbury of this city, conveyed the sad intelligence that his brother Mr. Morton Rattenbury, B. A., passed away at Tampa, Florida, on the morning of the 21st, inst.

The late Mr. Rattenbury was actively engaged in business in Charlottetown for many years and will be remembered by the older business men of this city and Province; as well as by many of the working men of the city who assisted him in his large pork packing operations, as a man of exceptional energy, enterprise, and executive ability.

He was educated at the Prince of Wales College, Windsor, Nova Scotia where he took his B. A. degree in 1885.

He enlisted and trained as a Private soldier and subsequently went overseas with his regiment. But at his age beyond his strength and usual health and he had been making his home in the winter season in Florida.

The news of the passing of Mr. Morton Rattenbury will be learned with widespread regret in his native Province. He was a man of almost in the prime of his manhood he has been called away. He ex-

plained in his earlier years "business incarnate," and among the many enterprising and prominent business men of this city and Province the name of Morton Rattenbury will be remembered. He was a man of strong convictions, and bore an honored name in his business dealings, here and in other parts of the Dominion. The fact that he enlisted in the War when he was so young, and that he was so strikingly advanced in life for such a young man, is evidence that he was intensely loyal to his king and patriotic to his country.
