

As usual there was a large attendance at the Opera House last night, and everybody thoroughly enjoyed themselves from start to finish.

Miss L. H. Seaman reached the city yesterday evening by the Northumberland, having completed her studies at Dalhousie College, Halifax.

The Guardian regrets to learn that Neil McKenzie, Bayfield St., is suffering from a slight attack of appendicitis. Mr. McKenzie was reported better yesterday.

D. Messervey reached the City by the late train from Summerside yesterday evening, having completed his studies at King's College till the Autumn term commences.

Commencing next week the Northumberland will leave this port for Pictou at eight o'clock a.m. and will leave Pictou on return at four forty-five, reaching here about eight-thirty p.m.

The Harland left the City at five thirty yesterday morning for East River, and leaving there at seven thirty reached Charlottetown about nine o'clock. She returned to East River at 3 o'clock in the afternoon, and reached the City from that place at about six o'clock.

Capt. D. C. Fraser of S. S. Bonavista on arrival at Montreal some few days ago, was waited on by members of the Montreal Harbor Commissioners and presented with a substantial memento, as being the first captain to arrive at the port of Montreal this season with a freight and passenger steamer. It looks as if Capt. Fraser would be entitled to some thanks from the merchants and shippers of Charlottetown as the Bonavista, due here at noon today, will likely be the first foreign steamer to enter this port this season.

I have a brother by the same name, also a sister Annie. I was taken from St. John (N. B.) to P. E. Island about twenty-four years ago, by Miss Eliza Weatherall, who died about eight years ago. I was when taken there, two and a half years old. My brother five and my sister six. My mother's name was Miss Knowlton before she was married. All attended the Episcopal church if any. "My foster mother brought me up as her own child, and I knew no difference until I had grown up, then he told me. By that time even she had lost all recollection of the little he had ever known of my relatives. She, too, is dead."
