MRS McKINLEY'S ILLNESS.

The American people naturally experience an anxious solicitude on account of Mrs. McKinley's alarming illness. The feeling approaches closely to what the British people would experience were Queen Alexandra now lying almost hopelessly ill, any difference in that regard being wholly caused by the limited term during which the head of the Republic may retain that exalted position. Both the President and Mrs. McKinley occupy a high place in the esteem and regard as well as in the admiration of the American people. The President is not only an able statesman and leader, but a devoted husband and father, and Mrs. McKinley has shown that she possesses those virtues which adorn the highest stations in life.

Some weeks ago, though in delicate health, she set out in company with the President to make a grand tour through the Southern and Pacific States. They were everywhere received with the most hearty and effusive welcome, and the warmth of the popular favor appeared to have very deeply impressed both the President and Mrs. McKinley. The almost continuous journey with few opportunities for rest, the somewhat abrupt changes of climate, together with the tension caused by meeting vast cheering crowds, appear to have too severely taxed her delicate powers of endurance, and Mrs. McKinley sunk under it after reaching San Francisco. Thousands of Canadians, so long as hope remains, will most earnestly desire and hope for the recovery of the distinguished lady, and will share in only less measure than the American people themselves the anxiety and solicitude of the hour.

The Toronto World has a strong article in favor of making Sydney the Canadian port for the fast Atlantic Line. The distance from Sydney to Southampton is 2067 miles, or little more than two-thirds of the distance from New York to Southampton. The steamer Deutschland has just made a record of 537 knots or 678 statute miles for a day's run. A three day's run at this rate of speed would bridge the distance between Sydney and Southampton. Some day not very far in the future we shall have a three day's Atlantic service and Canada building the ships,—perhaps at Sydney.

The Daughters of the Empire have been much incensed by the action of the Quebec City Council in consenting to the erection of the proposed monument to Gen. Montgomery. They have sent the following telegram to Sir Wilfrid Laurier, signed by their President, Margaret Polson Murray: "That in view of the proposed erection of a tablet in memory of General Montgomery, this federation, at the instance of all its branches throughout the Dominion, begs most respectfully to protest against such an insult to the patriotic feelings of the community, and pledges itself to the most vigorous and unanimous opposition to the project."

The national Parliament of France met yesterday and considerable interest centres in a forthcoming measure to be introduced by the Minister of Commerce and Industry to provide a pension system for aged and disabled working men and women. The Minister, M. Millerand is a Socialist, and the bill is a distinct concession to organized labor. A hopeful symptom, not only in France but in most continental countries, is that the working classes are the strongest opponents of war and the system of militarism generally. It is better to pension disabled working men than by needless war to force able bodied men into the battlefield and then pension the maimed soldiers.

Montreal has now but one gas company and pays \$1.20 per thousand feet for gas for lighting and \$1 per thousand feet for gas used for heating purposes. By competition about to be introduced it is hoped to bring the price down to 75 cents per thousand.

It is now stated that Governor Jones of Nova Scotia has received word that the Duke of Cornwall will make his first landing on Canadian soil at Quebec, about September 15. Halifax will be the point of departure for the Ducal party, either for New York or for Europe as may be arranged later. We are still without information as to the arrangements so far as a visit to P. E. Island is concerned.

It was indeed a strange statement made by Mr. Balfour in the British House of Commons on Thursday night last that at one moment toward the end of 1899 there were in Great Britain only 3,300 rounds of small firearm ammunition, with no reserve of artillery ammunition except what was actually with the guns retained at home. It is startling to think what might have occurred had Britain been suddenly attacked at such a moment of criminal unpreparedness by one or more of her powerful military enemies. Even now the revelation that such a condition has once existed may almost invite a sudden attack in the future. Public confidence in the War Office is naturally shaken by such an alarming disclosure.

The Toronto Telegram, independent Conservative, gives out the proposal that Mr. E. B. Osler, a very able man now representing West Toronto in the Commons, may resign his seat to take a hand in the provincial campaign against the Ross Administration. The Telegram adds: "There are people who see in the Hon. G. E. Foster's removal to Toronto a move to qualify him for the Conservative nomination in West Toronto upon Mr. Osler's resignation." THE GUARDIAN would be glad to find Mr. Foster again in public life, believing that it is in the interest of Canada that both of our great political parties shall be represented in Parliament by their ablest and most reputable public men. As a representative for Toronto Mr. Foster would hold a very influential position. The seat is a safe one for the Conservatives.

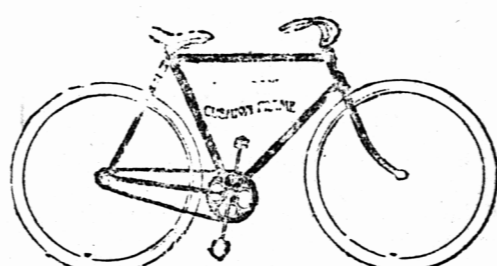
