**The Provincial Capital  
A Progressive Centre**

—In The Golden Future—

Charlottetown, the capital of Prince Edward Island, was originally called "Port la Joie" and was founded by the French in the Eighteenth century. It received its present name in honour of Queen Charlotte, wife of King George III. It was founded in 1763 and incorporated in 1855.

The Civic Government is composed of a Mayor and eight Councillors elected every two years. It is the seat of the Government of Prince Edward Island, and the Legislature of the Province is the second oldest in Canada.

Its wide streets are made of tarvia with concrete sidewalks and beautiful shade trees. At the present time we have practically twelve miles of paved streets, 7 miles of gravelled streets, 3 miles of water-bound macadam streets and 20 miles of concrete sidewalks.

The water supply of the City is second to none in the Dominion.

Adjoining the City is the splendid Victoria Park with over 100 acres of land facing the harbor. Adjoining the Park is Government House, a beautiful old mansion of Colonial style of architecture, which is the official residence of the Lieut.-Governor. There are in the City five beautiful public squares. In Queen Square, which is situated in the centre of the City, the following important buildings are located: The Provincial Building, Law Courts, Post Office, Customs Office, Dominion Savings Bank and also a Public Market Building and a Public Library and Art Gallery.

In 1864 in the Legislative Council Chamber of the Provincial Building was held the first meeting which led to the Confederation of Canada. A tablet in commemoration of this event will be found on the walls of this Chamber.

**Churches and Colleges**

A few of the places of interest in and around the City are the Roman Catholic Basilica, said to be the finest east of Montreal; Prince of Wales College, the head of our educational system; and St. Dunstan's University.

There are four public schools, a Model School and two Convents. The population of the City is made up of the following denominations each of which has its own splendid church or churches: Baptist, Presbyterian, Episcopalian, United Church and Roman Catholic.

The electric lighting system of the City is owned and operated by the Associated Gas and Electric System, which supplies power and light to the consumers at a low cost.

Pasteurized milk, as well as butter and ice cream are produced in local factories and distributed all over the Province. There are also several large canning industries, a candy manufacturing plant, woodworking factories and a large foundry.

There are two daily newspapers published in the city.

First class facilities at the Government wharves handle the large quantities of potatoes and other products shipped by water. The harbor is one of the finest on the Continent, able to accommodate ships of ocean going draft.

**Sporting Facilities**

Charlottetown possesses a splendid golf course within easy reach of the city. Cricket grounds, foot-ball and base-ball fields and tennis courts are to be found at Victoria Park. The Driving Park and Provincial Exhibition Association fair grounds and speedway compare favorably with any in the Maritime Provinces. Yachting and motor boating are popular on the harbors and rivers and a regatta is held each year under the auspices of the Charlottetown Yacht Club.

Charlottetown is the centre of the mercantile trade of the Province and both the wholesale and retail stores are a credit to the city. They are noted for their fine display of goods at very reasonable prices.

There have been no large fires within the city for several years. This is due, in large part, to the efficient fire fighting department.

**Fish Chowder**

1/2-pound fat salt pork, cut in small pieces  
2 onions, sliced  
3 pounds white-fleshed fish, cut in small pieces  
(cod, haddock or halibut)  
3 cups uncooked potato cubes  
4 cups boiling water  
Pilot biscuit  
2 cups St. Charles MILK  
1 tablespoon salt  
1/2 teaspoon pepper  
1 tablespoon minced parsley  
1 tablespoon flour

Fry salt pork in a deep kettle until crisp. Cook onion in fat five minutes. Add fish and potatoes. Cover with the boiling water and simmer slowly until potatoes are soft. Pour in the milk slowly. Cook five minutes longer. Add seasonings and thicken with the flour and butter blended. Pour over pilot biscuit.
