The funeral took place Friday, December 29th, at 2:00 p. m., and despite the storm was largely attended. Rev. L. J. Leard conducted the services at the house and in the church at Bideford.

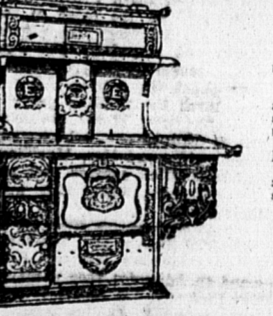
