EXCHANGE

NEW YORK, Oct. 9.—(CP) The Russian note to the powers on Spain, together with further political rumblings in France, caused some nervousness in Foreign Exchange Markets today but most of the former gold currencies and sterling came back in late trading for gains against the United States dollar.
 The French franc was an exception to the belated recovery trend, closing lower. Pounds sterling developed strength.
 In London the United States dollar closed 1 1-8 lower at \$4.90 5-8 to the pound and in Paris the American unit ended at 4.669 cents to the franc against an overnight New York rate of 4.672 cents.

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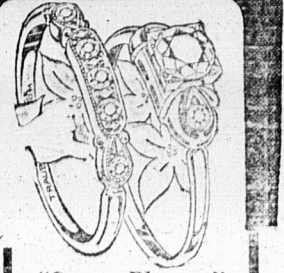
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
