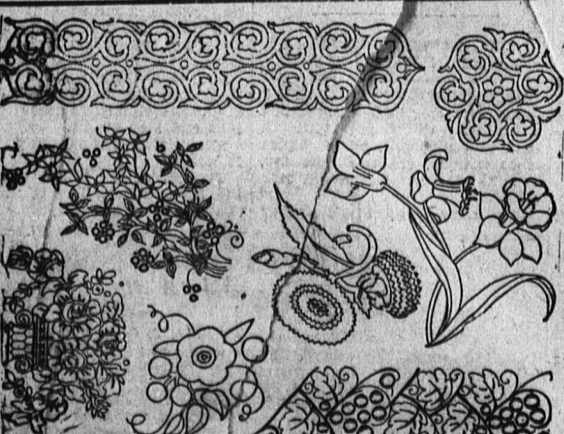

THE COOK'S CORNER

BUNCH-OF-GRAPES SALAD

This is one of the easiest of the "arranged" types of fruit salad. A quick spreading of the pears with soft cheese, the placing of the grape halves on the cheese-spread pears—and you're ready to complete a most interesting and appealing salad-dessert.

Drained canned pear halves. White cream or cottage cheese. Red or blue sweet grapes. Crisp lettuce. Angelica. Thick salad dressing. Mash the white cream or cottage cheese until soft and smooth, mixing with a little cream or salad dressing if necessary. Spread over the rounded surface of the pears. Have the grapes cut in two, and seeded; arrange them over the cheese on the pears, to represent a bunch of grapes. Arrange one pear half in each crisp individual lettuce bed.

RICH DATE-GINGER DESSERT

This is not the sort of thing we usually mean when we talk about fruit desserts and their benefits to Spring appetites. But, nevertheless, it will answer well, on the score of its unusual character and extreme deliciousness. Note how easily it is made.

Chopped pitted dates. Finely minced candied ginger. Rich milk or slightly diluted evaporated milk. Unsweetened whipped cream. Chopped nuts (optional). Milk chopped, pitted dates with finely minced ginger to taste. Cover with rich milk or slightly diluted evaporated milk and chill until the dates have softened and the flavors have blended. Place a small amount of the mixture in each individual serving glass and top lightly with unsweetened whipped cream. Chopped nuts, though not necessary, are a delicious and attractive garnish.

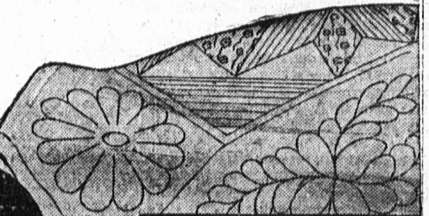
