PREPARATIONS AT
RUSSIAN OFFICE

ST. PETERSBURG, July 12.—The
preparation which the war office has been
making at all the principal cities to meet
an armed revolutionary movement prove
to have been very elaborate. The plans
for the defense of Riga have fallen into
the hands of the revolutionary paper
Misa, which this morning publishes
the entire plan of defence. As given,
the garrison is divided into three divisions
of two battalions of infantry, half a com-
pany of Cossacks, and three machine guns
each, to prevent the invasion of the city
from its three open sides, namely, the
canal, the dam and the river. Two battal-
ions of infantry, two hundred Cossacks
and four machine guns constitute the re-
serve. The commander, in framing the plan
of defence, even designated his successor
in the event himself being killed or
incapacitated. Similar plans, it is
understood, have been drawn up by every
commander of a garrison or city. In
addition special troop trains equipped
with machine and field guns are in
constant readiness at St. Petersburg,
Moscow, Kiev, Warsaw and other
strategic points.

BISLEY, July 11.—Colonel Wilson,
commandant of the Canadian team,
had the entire team shoot in three
competitions this morning in order to

represent Canada in the MacKinnon cup

The matches in question were the
Alexander Martin at 800 yards, Ar-
mourers at 900, and Kynock at 1,000,
the three ranges over which the
MacKinnon contest will be shot. The day
was most unfavorable for good shooting,
the light being poor and the wind tricky,
the result being that scoring all along the
line was not up to the average. Gavin of
Victoria was the only man in the lot to
put in a respectable score, and his was not
much, an 88. Some of the best shots in
the team fell down. It must be remem-
bered that the conditions were of a
disheartening character.
