WINNIPEG, Jan. 4—(CP)—Oats and barley prices moved more briskly today, as late trade on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange increased in activity after a dull early session.
Moderate local selling, plus some hedging sales, came into early trade in feed grains, but as business closed good demand from shippers and processors found offerings light.
Rye also pushed up after early losses, on steady buying attributed to American accounts. Flax was listless, seldom making the board.
In the export business, 925,000 bushels of Canadian wheat were allocated to the United Kingdom under the long term agreement.

B. O. A. C. CUTS PAY
LONDON, Jan. 4—(AP)—The British Overseas Airways Corporation disclosed today it has slashed the pay of some of its administrative staff up to 25 per cent. Some jobs have been wiped out. B.O.A.C. is in the process of reorganizing and merging with British South American Airways. Both are state-owned.

Manitoba Pair Escape Jail In Howling Blizzard

WINNIPEG, Jan. 3—(CP)—Police concentrated tonight on the Winnipeg district in efforts to locate two convicts, who escaped from Headingly Jail during a howling blizzard yesterday.
A general alert has been flashed across Western Canada, Northern Ontario and mid-west United States.
Paul Sportak, 22, of Spurgrove, Man., and Walter Fayant, 31, of no fixed abode, walked away from jail property yesterday afternoon as a snowstorm lashed Southern Manitoba. They made good their escape in 20-below zero weather. Both were trustees and short-term prisoners.
Sportak had been serving 12 months for having a still and was due for release April 3.
Fayant was serving six months for breaking and entering and theft.
The escapees had been tending stock near the prison farm. Each was dressed warmly in a sheepskin coat, dark cloth caps and dark pants.
Tracks left by Sportak and Fayant were followed south from prison property but drifting snow wiped out the trail.
Headlines is about 12 miles west of Winnipeg and the direction of the tracks indicated that the men intended to set out for Winnipeg.
