## MR. FOSTER'S REPLY.

The reply of Hon. George E. Foster to the budget speech of the Finance Minister bristled with points. He strongly arraigned the Government, after coming into power on a platform of economy and retrenchment, for having increased the expenditure from 41 millions in 1896 to 62 millions in 1906. He charged that they had taken 130 millions more out of the pockets of the people than the Confederation took in a like period of ten years. He severely criticized the Intercolonial deficits, and the too numerous crop of scandals.

Mr. Foster also dwelt on the fact that Mr. Fielding admits that for new works and to pay expiring loans he would require to borrow some 300 millions within the next four years. The time is now unfavorable for borrowing. He contended forcibly, and the country will agree with him, that something should have been saved out of the enormous revenues of recent years. Now the Government is paying 4 per cent for short loans at the banks, while a few years ago money could be had at 2 1/2 to 3 per cent. It is not a good time to borrow 300 millions, but the money must be had, and a rate of lavish expenditure has been set that renders present retrenchment difficult, if not impossible.

## WOMAN SUFFRAGE IN BRITAIN.

Notwithstanding the excessive zeal of some women suffragists which led to their being ejected from the gallery of the House of Commons recently, the cause of feminine suffrage appears to be making progress in Great Britain. On the 15th instant some 40 women visited Premier Sir Campbell Bannerman, and though he would give them no definite promise, (at which some of their number appeared greatly incensed) he frankly avowed himself in sympathy with the movement.

Mr. Balfour, who leads the Opposition, is also on record in favor of admitting considerable classes of women to parliamentary suffrage. Women already vote and are entitled to hold offices in municipal elections there. Resolutions favoring woman suffrage are an annual offering in British Parliament, with increasing support from year to year. As it is, English women take a much more active and prominent part in elections than their Canadian and American sisters do. Though the United States is the home of the women's rights movement, the New York Times is convinced that women will be admitted to vote in England long before they have like privilege in America or France.

Springshill, N. S., rejoices in the gift, by a New York lady of \$15,000 to its Cottage Hospital.

That was a pretty large demand of the Duma, asking for amnesty to all criminals. There seems a fair reason to hold at least the Anarchist bomb-throwers in duration for a time.

The Russian Parliament does not follow British Parliamentary precedents. The address in reply was very far from being the mere echo to the speech from the throne as we have it in British countries.

If Russia had responsible Government, as we have, the Ministry would be bound to resign on the adoption of a reply such as the National Assembly, or Duma, has given.

## PRINCE OF WALES COLLEGE.

Prince of Wales had an auspicious convocation yesterday afternoon, at which His Honor, the Lieutenant Governor presided very happily. An unusually large share, more than one fourth of the students who won certificates, belong to Charlottetown, a fact which contrasts strongly with the showing of many former years and is much to the credit of our city teachers. Eleven of the successful students come from Upper Prince Street school; eight from West Kent, and two from Queen Square, while twenty-three of the diplomas were carried off by Charlottetown boys and girls.

Miss Lily Seaman is to be congratulated on winning the High Honor Diploma and the Anderson Gold Medal at an extraordinarily early age. She, with the seven other winners of medals and prizes and a like number who won honor diplomas are to be heartily congratulated. Prince of Wales is doing good work for which Principal Robertson and his associates deserve recognition. With enlarged room awaiting them in the future, thanks to the generosity of Sir William McDonald, we confidently predict that the course of our provincial College will be onward and upward with increasing usefulness and popularity until it becomes a degree conferring institution.

The trouble with the natives in Natal appears still to be serious. They far outnumber the whites and are still in a warlike mood. Business in the colony is at a stand still and great alarm exists.

The Patriot's Ottawa despatch of Wednesday last says Mr. Fielding's budget speech "occupied about five hours," while The Guardian's Ottawa despatch made the time of delivery five minutes over one hour. So far as our reading goes there appear to be many newspapers which represent the budget speech to have been a little more than one hour in length, which is certainly short for a deliverance of so much importance. Mr. Fielding has the happy faculty of condensation coupled with clearness.
