GERMAN NOBLE RELEASED. HANOVER, PRUSSIA, August 22.—Prince Prosper of Arenburg, who was condemned to death by a court-martial in German Southwest Africa in 1889 for murder and other crimes committed against the natives, but whose sentence was subsequently commuted, has been discharged as cured from the sanatorium at Oberode, where he had been confined since he was pronounced insane in 1904. The prince will go to Argentina, in charge of a guardian appointed by the court where he will become a farmer. His title has been dropped, the court having given him the name of Blandien.

BABY PIPE SMOKER BLOWS FINE RINGS.

PHOENIXVILLE, Pa., Aug. 22.—Three-year-old Peter Doeck, who lives here, astonished a crowd of passers-by who were gathered at a station here by contentedly smoking a long-stemmed pipe. Occasionally he would "blow rings." The father says that the boy has been smoking daily since he was six months old, and that he could think of no greater punishment for the boy than to take his pipe away. This, he said, he threatens to do whenever Peter is bad, and invariably Peter reforms.

When Peter was six months old some one playfully thrust a pipe in his mouth. The child at once seized it with both hands and began to puff on it. He cried when it was taken away and would not be consoled until it had been returned to him. While the crowd watched Peter he twice refilled his pipe from a small sack of ordinary tobacco. Which he carried in a special pocket sewed on his suit. He smokes like a veteran, drawing deeply and emitting the smoke in dense volumes. He has never shown any ill effects from the habit and is good sized. He has never been sick.

The boy is a native of this country. On his third birthday, the father, at his son's request, presented him with a handsome briar pipe with a long stem and deep bowl.

KING REVIVES CUSTOM.

LONDON, August 22.—It is apparent that King George does not intend, as his father did, to dispense with the attendance of a member of the Cabinet when he is away from London.

Mr. Asquith, the Prime Minister, it is announced, will be at Balmoral for ten days in attendance upon the King, follow him in rotation, so that H. M. Majesty always will have a Minister at hand during the vacation.

Formerly the sovereign when away from London, in the country or on the Continent, was always attended by a Minister. The Minister was usually the Secretary of State.

King Edward did not always follow this tradition, and as often as not there was no member of the Cabinet with him when he spent long periods at Hamburg, Marienbad or Biarritz twice a year.
