HOME FIREMEN WIN.—The opening events in the Firemen's Tournament which is now being held in Halifax and in which this Province is represented by a team of the Charlottetown Fire Department, were held Tuesday, and it is gratifying to record that the local contingent came creditably out of the keen competition in which they participated. A telegram to Keeper Matthew Murphy, of the Fire Station, Tuesday evening from Chief Ranaghan Halifax, gave intimation of the pleasing fact that the local men had secured second place in the hose-reel race, Glace Bay winning in 71 seconds. The teams, composed of ten each, had to run a quarter of a mile, carrying 300 feet of hose, lay 250 feet, break coupling, put in the nozzle and connect with the hydrant. That this severe test was performed in a little over a minute is extremely creditable to the winning team.

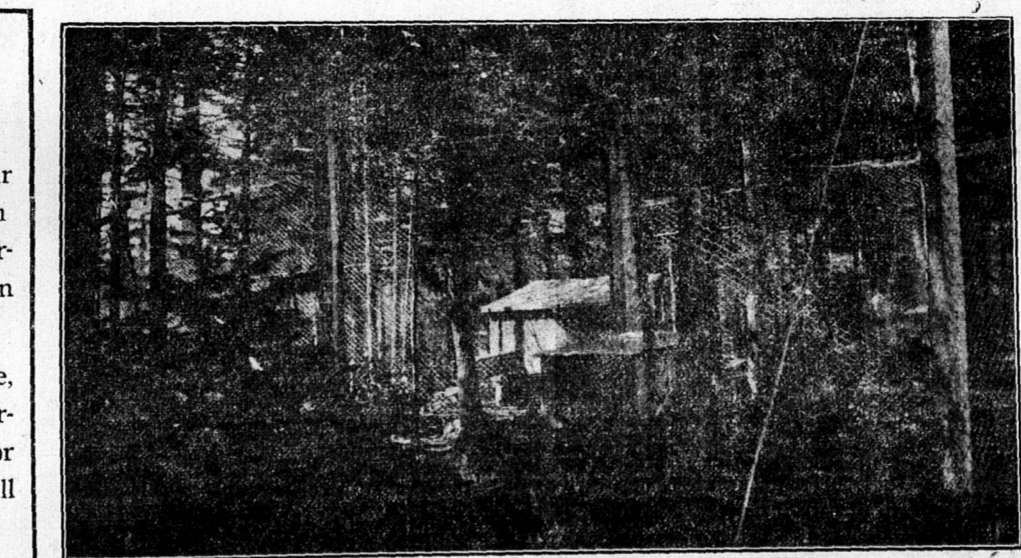
