IMPORTANT SCOTT ACT DECISION.

In Moncton where the Scott Act is nominally enforced, but had not been really so, a more strenuous effort began some months since and Stipendiary Magistrate McKay of that town had the courage to sentence some of the convicted violators to jail without the option of a fine. This three consideration into the ranks of the liquor men, and they appealed to the Supreme Court against the Magistrate's decision. Now that court has decided that the Magistrate has ample power under the Act to impose sentence of imprisonment.

This interpretation of the Scott Act enables an honest and fair ex Magistrate to use it as a very powerful weapon for the extermination of the liquor traffic. The decision is the more important from the fact that a very large portion of the Provinces of New Brunswick and Nova Scotia are under the Scott Act, and the growing determination of the people to close the saloons will call for imprisonment instead of fines in a host of cases. When a vigorous effort is made along these lines to enforce the Scott Act it will create a stir across the Straits. The Scott Act is not dead, "though it hath slept."

Hon. Mr. Fielding has gone to Colchester to assist in the bye-election campaign there. He will not allow the Opposition to get even a single seat in Nova Scotia if he can help it. They have none now.

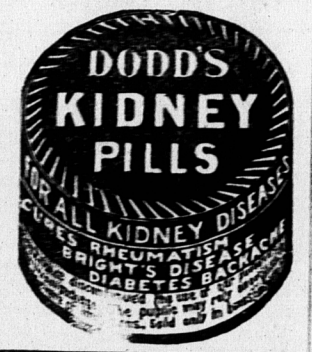
The discharge of many employees by the great employing concerns in the States is sending them to Canada in search of work. There is yet no depression on this side, but the Government is declining to bring on the election next spring are apparently apprehensive that times may not be so good a year from now as they now are.

The winter steamer Montcalm has rounded and sprung leak, while the Stanley and Minto are undergoing repairs. Some day, it may be feared, one of these ice-breakers may become a total loss in their hazardous work. We hope the day may be distant, as so much depends on their safety, but the accidents that have already happened show that the risk is one that must be carried, whether the Government pays insurance or not.

The sudden drop in the prices for oats just as the farmers had got to work hauling to market is to them unaccountable and is but another cogent argument for

the regular and persistent transportation which the Tunnel alone can afford. Nobody would worry about the oats if there was some efficient and reasonably cheap means of shipping out of the Province all winter. And that will be the only thing the country will be satisfied with.

It is to be hoped that the transportation conditions will permit of a large attendance of Island farmers at the Albert Winter Fair December 3-6. The entries, we are told, are more numerous than ever. Fat cattle, sheep, swine, poultry and the grain, fruit and honey exhibits are always worth seeing. Then the speaking is usually by the best agricultural publicists in Canada. It promises to be better than ever this year.
