### Sister Bertha Trotted Very Fast Mile at Lexington

Three-Year-Old Equalled the World's Record of 2.03 Made in 1917—Racing Not up to Standard

LEXINGTON, Oct. 11.—Saturday's Grand Circuit racing here while good was hardly up to the standard of previous days. The feature of the card was the Kentucky for three-year-olds, sister event to the Lexington and the oldest harness race on the trotting turf. It was won by David Look's Day Star driven by Dick McMahon. In each heat he lowered his previous record of 2:04 3-4 trotting the first heat in 2:06 1-2, and the second in 2:06 1-4.

Natalie The Great, a filly that has been his opponent for two years stood second in the summary; King Harvester was third and Dudette due to bad racing luck, was fourth. Her sulky wheel was smashed in the second heat.

Just David had little difficulty in winning the first division of the 2:16 trot, which came first on the afternoon's program. Mightell, a previous winner at the meeting who was expected to finish the main contention was unsteady and spoiled her chances by breaks. Fourth money being her position.

Captain Mack won the 2:12 pace, taking the second and third heats. The opening round went to J. L. Jr., in 2:05 1-2. Captain Mack was forced to take a win race record of 2:04 1-4 in the second heat. Driven by Palin was fined \$100 on a charge of not trying to win the first heat. The closing race went to Wagner, from the stables of Frank Hedrick. The judges were not pleased with the drive McKellar was giving Bilston and Harry Stokes was put up. However, second was the best Bilston could do.

The real feature of the day occurred in the morning when A. B. Cox's Sister Bertha, driven by Joe Sherrill trotted a trial mile a new time record of 2:03, equalling the world's record for three year old trotters made here in 1917 by the Real Lady. The new record holder is a sister to Miss Bertha Dillon, champion four year old filly and holder of the world's record

in a race of 2:03 1-4. The mile was beautifully raced, the first three-quarters each being trotted in 31 seconds and the final quarter in exactly 30 seconds.

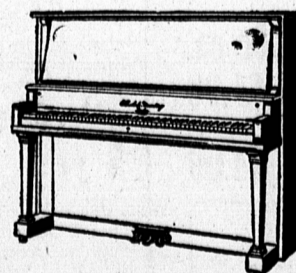

horses, 17 pigs, 1 automobile and sundry other cargo on deck. Two of the horses shipped were speedy trotting mares. One of them, the Lady Be Sure, raced here Exhibition week and was greatly admired; the other was a fast horse sired by Captain Aubrey. This shipment was made by Mr. John Horne to Thomas Curran, St. John's.

Among the stock shipped there were some valuable pure bred animals for the Newfoundland gov-

ernment. These included 1 Clydesdale stallion, 1 Ayrshire bull, one Holstein cow, 7 horned Dorset sheep, 3 Tamworth pigs, all for breeding purposes. The Canadian Miner has carried a large quantity of produce from here since she started on this route last spring, besides over 1000 head of cattle, 250 horses over 2000 pigs and a great number of sheep and lambs. Fur is going to be more popular this winter than ever before, and American lamb, dyed jade green, ducks' egg blue and plum color, monkey fur and sealskin will be the ones most worn, according to furriers and fashion experts here.
