U. S. Objects To Interference WASHINGTON, Nov. 21 (AP)—Great Britain has been notified that the United States does not intend to tolerate any interference with genuinely neutral trade on the high seas. Sumner Welles, acting secretary of state, in a report today said that this would have gone along with the assertion that the United States naturally was reserving all its rights under international law.

Press Censors Ban Twelve Publications OTTAWA, Nov. 21 (CP)—The press censors have banned 12 publications from Canada under section 39A of the Defence of Canada Regulations, which prohibits spreading reports which might cause disaffection or prejudice relations with foreign powers.
