EDGE OF THE WORLD

"Professor Todd thinks we can pick up messages from Mars easily at the edge of this world's atmosphere. I know little about astronomy, but I have guaranteed to take him where he wants to go in my car."

"The flight will take five or six hours. We will carry a small supply of heat-creating food to help us withstand the intense cold should emergency arise. The whole wireless apparatus, including the ten miles of wire which will train from the basket of the balloon down toward the earth, will weigh about 200 pounds."

"I believe we will come down alive altho this trip which will have to be the highest ever made will be attended with some danger. We must reach ten miles, the professor tells me, to obtain the best results. Eight miles is the greatest height ever before reached in a balloon, and then members of the party died from cold and rarity of air."

"We are making these aluminum tanks to prevent just such a disaster. The tanks will be provided with glass fronts so that we can see our instruments, which will be arranged in front. As soon as the air gets so cold and thin that we cannot remain comfortable we will crawl in to the tanks, close the covers after us and settle back in our chairs."

"Tanks of oxygen will be connected with the air tight compartments by tubes and the taps of the valve will send the life-giving gas to us. A gauge to determine the air pressure in our tanks will occupy a position directly in front of us, and a cord attached to a safety valve will be within hands' reach."

"Both Dr. Todd and I will begin training for the trip in July. We will have tanks of oxygen sent to our homes and will begin breathing it to get accustomed against the time when we may have nothing else. This training will be continued systematically up to the time of ascension."

"The ground wires will also be used in carrying any message from Mars we may receive straight down to the earth where they will be recorded. I will take Dr. Todd on numerous ascensions between now and the time for our big flight to get him used to ballooning. He will succeed in this venture if any one can."

ICE BLOCKADE OFF NEWFOUNDLAND.
