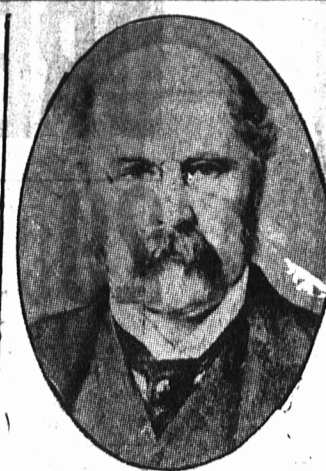
LOST HIS HAT AND DROWNED

THE EDITOR'S MAIL

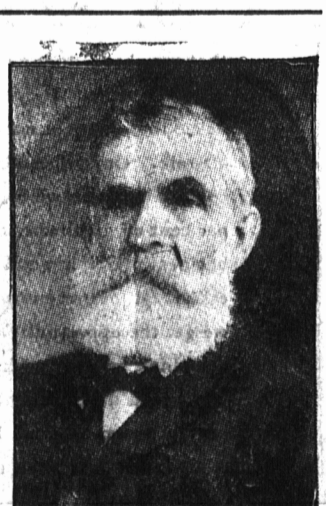
