TOPEKA, Kan., July 7.—After printing a weekly series from the Bible for three months, Arthur J. Carruth, managing editor of The Topeka State Journal, declares that the publication of the Bible has proved to be the greatest success of any feature ever printed by the State Journal. Moreover, it is being read by many subscribers as faithfully as would be the instalments of a popular novel Carruth states.

"The publication of the Bible serially has had a marvellous effect," said Mr. Carruth. "It has shown that the subscribers are sincere in their demand for religious material of a religious character, and also has shown to the public that the newspapers do not print only the sensational, but attempt to appeal primarily to the masses and that they do not neglect the church."

As an indication of the interest taken in the publication of the Bible, Mr. Carruth stated he had received inquiries from every state in the nation, many letters from Canada, and a number of communications from foreign countries. A number of Kansas newspapers have taken up the publication of the Bible since The Journal started it. PARIS, July 7.—The League disarmament committee today recommended the disposition to be made of the plan submitted by Lord Robert Cecil for extending the Washington accord to all the naval powers. It decided unanimously to refer it to the naval sub-committee, with instructions to notify all the interested powers, and prepare a report on it for submission to the Assembly of the League in September.

More than 100,000 organized workers, radicals, socialists and communists, paraded with red flags, republican flags and brass bands "against the reaction" and "for the republic." The heavy-armed security police had all been withdrawn from the streets to avoid possible clashes and shooting entailing bloodshed, being skillfully hidden in the zoological garden and cellars of public buildings. Their services were not needed, as no reactionaries attempted a counter-demonstration and the highly-organized republican army of more than 100,000 was able to pull off its big show without disorders or incidents.

From all parts of greater Berlin this pro-republican army of workers, socialists and communists, men, women and even children in baby carriages, and war cripples in sheeted chairs, converged on the demonstration's focal point, the Kaiserin Augusta Victoria Memorial Church in the west end and from there they were skillfully deflected fanwise through five great diverging avenues.

An almost complete general strike tied up Berlin all afternoon during the period of all demonstration.

SPRINTING MARVEL SMASHES RECORDS RIGHT AND LEFT

SANTA BARBARA, Cal., July 6.—Charles Paddock, running 100 yards here set two world's records and tied a third. He made a new record of sixty yards in 6 1/5 seconds, clipping one-fifth of a second off, and also a new record for seventy yards, in 7 1/10 seconds one-fifth of a second faster than the old record. He tied the record of 9 3/5 seconds for 100 yards.

In the second race Paddock stepped a new world's record for eighty yards. The time was 7 4/5 seconds. The old record was eight seconds. He also equalled the seventy-five yard record of 7 3/5 seconds.

In the third sprint Paddock clipped 1 1/5 seconds from the world's record for 175 yards, running it in 17 flat. The former record was 18 1/5 seconds. Paddock also set a new record of 12 1/5 seconds for the 125 yard dash. The old record was 12 2/5 seconds.

MAN DURING ICE AGE

In a recent article published in Science, Julius Pia calls attention to the establishment of public institutions for the study of the ice age. Dr. T. Bayer of the Natural History Museum of Vienna, is in charge of the work and invites correspondents on the part of those interested.

Scarcely any department of scientific research is of more general interest than that which concerns prehistoric man his development during the Ice Age and the changes then taking place in the conformation of the land and sea.

The geographical position of Vienna renders it well adapted for such study, since the land structures associated with the glacial epoch can be readily observed in their relations to ancient environment. Lower Austria is well known to have furnished a rich store of stone implements and weapons.

Every effort will be made at the Natural History Museum to investigate on a broad scientific basis the various phenomena associated with the Ice Age.
