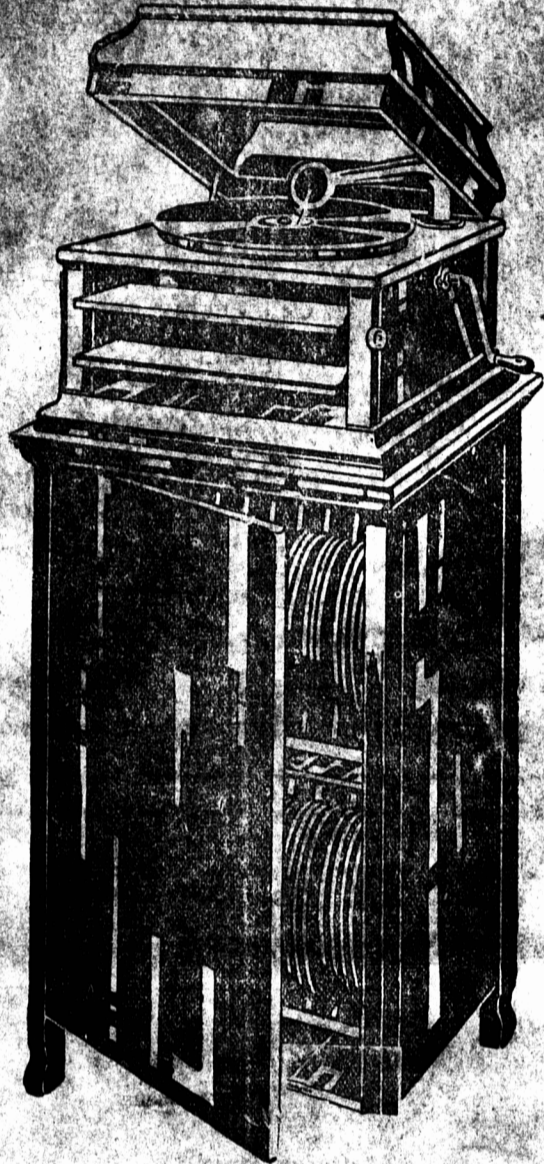

NEW CANADIAN PACIFIC TOURIST CARS

Did you ever examine the cars in which you travel years after year and notice the improvements made for your Safety, Convenience and Comfort?

The Canadian Pacific Railway Company has just perfected a new type of tourist car, of steel construction. The outstanding advantages of the tourist car are that it is a more economical, although less luxurious means of travelling than the Standard Sleeper, and also that it is more comfortable for the woman car passenger. The clean towels are packed in a box, the soiled ones go into a basket under the box. These rooms are absolutely sanitary—open plumbing seen to that.

The car, proper, contains fourteen sections, is furnished in mahogany and rejoices in a strip of carpet down the middle of the floor.
