FISH AND GAME PROTECTION ASSOCIATION
 Hold Quarterly Meeting-Report Of Executive And Other Business

A quarterly meeting of the P.E.I. Fish and Game Protection Association was held last Friday evening in the City Building, the president being in the chair.
 In his opening remarks the president spoke of the success that had attended the lectures given in the country districts, by the secretary, and of the encouragement he had received from those who formerly had been adverse to the Association, who stated that they had been entirely misled concerning the Association and who promised that in future it should have their support.
 The minutes of the previous meeting having been read and approved, the report of the Executive was laid before the meeting. It read as follows:—
 "Your Executive in making their quarterly report are gratified to be able to state that far greater interest than ever is being taken by the people at large in the protection of fish and game.
 The fact that no official complaints have been made of any illegal trout fishing this winter seems to point to a better observance of the fishery regulations than has formerly been the custom. Some complaints however have been received but upon being investigated it was found that they could not be substantiated. Trout have been sold in this city but it has been impossible to secure sufficient evidence to warrant a prosecution. Unfortunately those who purchase trout in the close season do not seem to realize they are breaking the law, and by buying the fish really countenance and encourage the nefarious business.
 As ordered at the last quarterly meeting, your Executive has prepared and forwarded a memorial to the Minister of Marine and Fisheries on the subjects of the Warden system and the close season for trout.
 A draft Act, embodying the Amendment passed at the last quarterly meeting, has been prepared as directed and it will be laid by His Honour the Lieut-Governor before the Legislature in order that it may be made law.
 As directed at the last quarterly meeting, your Executive appointed a committee to wait upon the Local Government to urge them to grant a salary to the Game Inspector. That committee will meet the Government at an early date.
 Two parties have written asking for a two year's close season for mink, urging that mink are so scarce their extinction is to be feared. A number of letters have also been received protesting against such a course being pursued. Your Ex-

ecutive recommend that no action be taken in the matter until the wishes of those who would be effected by such legislation shall have been ascertained.
 Some parties are trying, for personal reasons, to revive the opposition to the Association. As that opposition is entirely based on incorrect information it is not to be expected to be long lived.
 Your Executive are pleased to be able to report that the farming community are taking great interest in the Secretary's lecture on useful birds. Numbers of applications are being received to have the lecture repeated in various sections. So far the lecture has been well received wherever delivered, the people gladly paying all the necessary expenses incurred. The Executive have purchased an acetylene generator, and with the lantern kindly loaned by the Y.M.L.A. of St. James' church, are enabled to give these lectures with very small expenses.
 The report being received, the Federal Government's order in Council placing a five dollar fee on all foreigners coming to fish trout in this Province was taken up for consideration. After considerable discussion it was moved by S. F. Tarbush, seconded by Prof. J. McSwain that the Association deplores the action of the Dominion Government in placing an extra license fee on foreigners taking out Anglers' permits as such a course will prove extremely detrimental to the tourist trade, from which the Province receives great benefit. Therefore resolved that the Association urge the Local Government to protest against the Order-in-Council, establishing such additional fee, and ask for its repeal.
 In support of this resolution it was claimed that Quebec, Ontario and P. E. Island have similar laws regarding Anglers Permits, and as Ontario and Quebec are exempt from the provisions of the Order in Council because of their local Legislation, it is only just that we too should be exempt. The resolution passed unanimously.
 In the matter of a close season for mink, it was left with Executive to ascertain the wishes of the people on the subject, and to report at a future meeting. The meeting then adjourned.

Synopsis of Canadian North-West HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS
 A New even numbered section of Dominion Land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, excepting 8 and 20, not reserved may be homesteaded by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section 160 acres, more or less.
 Applications for entry must be made in person by the applicant at a Dominion Land Agency or Subagency for the district in which the land is situated. Entry by proxy may however be made at an Agency on certain conditions by the father or mother, son, daughter brother or sister of any intending homesteader. The homesteader is required to perform the homestead duties under one of the following plans.
 (1) At least six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year for three years.
 (2) A homesteader may, if it so desired perform the required residence duties by living on farming land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of his homestead. Joint ownership in land will not meet this requirement.
 (3) If the father or mother, if the father deceased of homesteader has permanent residence on farming land owned solely by him not less than eighty (80) acres in extent in the vicinity of the homestead, or upon a homestead entered for by him in the vicinity such homesteader may perform his own residence duties by living with the father or mother.
 (4) The term "vicinity" in the two preceding paragraphs is defined as meaning not more than five miles in a direct line, exclusive of the width of road allowance crossed in the measurement.
 (5) A homesteader intending to perform his residence duties in accordance with the above while living with parents and or on farming land owned by himself must notify the Agent for the district of such intention.
 Six months' notice in writing should be given to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa, of intention to apply for patent.
