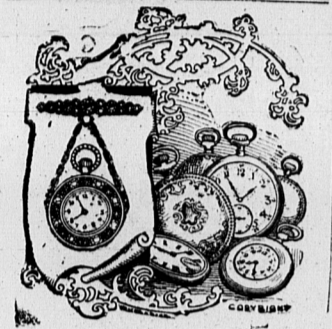

Rev. G. M. Young has notified the authorities of the Dartmouth Methodist church that he was unable to accept their invitation to become pastor of the Dartmouth Methodist church. -Halifax ex. (Rev. Mr. Young is a former pastor of First Methodist Church, City.)

At a convention of the Baptist Young Peoples' Union in Montreal the question of Church Union was discussed. The Rev. Dr. Gordon, native of this province, who took part in the discussion, would eliminate from what was usually considered Baptist, that liberty which was but another form of anarchy and the traditions of the fathers, to which a place almost divine was often given. We need a house cleaning in the Baptist church to eliminate some things often called Baptist, and to return to the basal principles. These, and the evangelization and education of the disciple. And this message should be offered not in any controversial spirit but in love.

Valuable presents of cut glass, silver and other useful articles were received by the bride. Guests from St. John, Moncton, Salisbury, Coverdale and Sackville were present at the wedding. Mr. and Mrs. Geldart left this afternoon on the C.P. R. R. for a wedding trip through Nova Scotia. Returning they will reside in Coverdale. -Ec. (Rev. 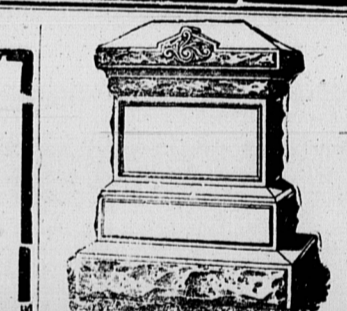
WAS IT A SUICIDE OR WAS IT A MURDER
