Not only are they benefited by their milk checks monthly, but they save time, trouble and horse flesh in the hauling of their produce to market over the worst roads of the season.—Fishing has been dull round these coasts the last week, not many mackerel have been caught and not many looking for them on account of the low price. Hake fishing was stopped for a few days on account of a school of dog-fish which came into our waters like an avalanche, eating the fish off the hooks, cutting the lines and playing havoc with the fishing gear generally, but they are gone at present and fishing is resumed with a fair amount of success. Speed at Sea.

With 35,000 horse-power the Deutschland's engines sent her across the Atlantic in 2 days 11 hours and 45 minutes at an average speed of 23.32 knots (nearly 27 miles) an hour.

With 23,000 horse-power the Kaiser Wilhelm der Grosse's engines sent her the same distance in 5 days 14 hours and 50 minutes, at an average speed of 22.79 knots (about 26 miles) an hour.

Therefore, 7,000 horse-power had to be developed and maintained to increase the speed less than a mile an hour in a voyage of 3,533 geographical miles—only three hours and five minutes in more than five and a half days. And that 7,000 horse-power means a huge increase not only in the original cost of the machinery but also in the cost of coal.

Clearly the improvements in speed must soon be sought through other machinery and other motive power. These small curtailments of the ocean voyage are interesting, but not important when the return is measured with the cost. Beside the average landsman is not so much interested in schemes for cutting off the end of the voyage as he is in schemes for cutting off the beginning—those two or three days of misery beyond the descriptive powers of language.

IMPORTANT IF TRUE.

The discovery of the fact that bioxyde of sodium absorbs the carbonic acid gas from air that has been breathed ascertains the oxygen, is of great importance, and can be made practically useful in many ways. That the chemical has the property mentioned was demonstrated yesterday by experiments before the French Academy of Science in Paris. Equipped with an apparatus containing a supply of air and a quantity of the bioxyde, divers will be able to do their work without the handicap of an air-pipe connecting them with a pump above; miners will be able to enter passages filled with noxious gases, and firemen to go into buildings dense with smoke, with impunity. Use of the chemical will facilitate the use of submarine boats. The discovery has naturally aroused much interest.
