

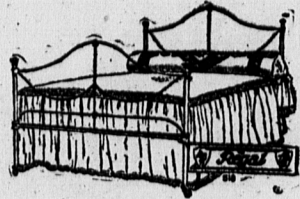

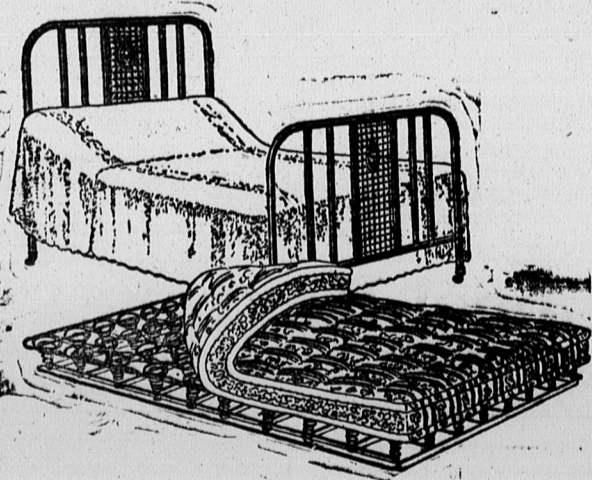

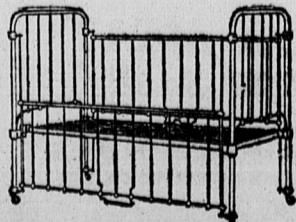

The English of Et tu, Brute, is You spoke not wisely, but too much. Any good latinist will tell you that.

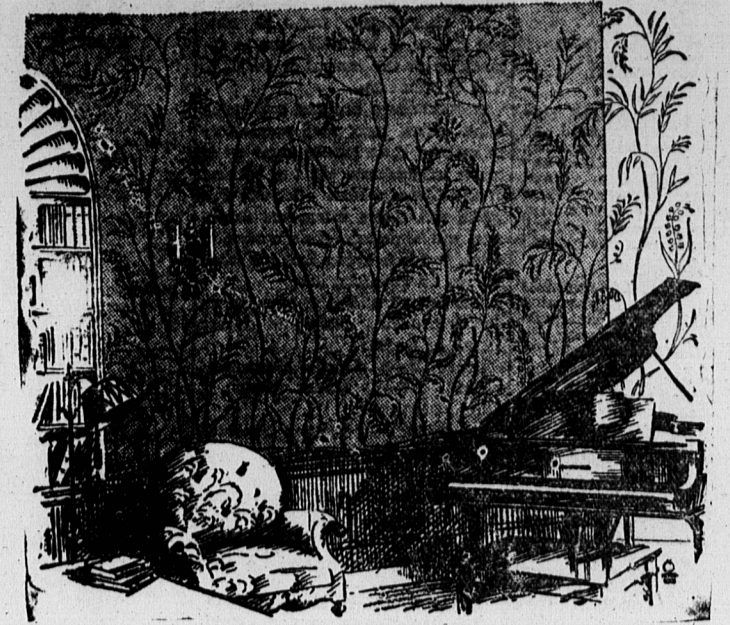

### SCIENTISTS STUDY MARINE LIFE AND GROWTH

SYDNEY, Australia, April 15.—Specimens of many remarkable fish have been blotted, neatly labeled and stored in the laboratory of the Danish expedition ship Dana, now in Newcastle harbor. The trim little vessel is on a two years' cruise of the seven seas with the object of making fresh discoveries in marine life and growth.

A small army of scientists connected with the Carlsburg Foundation is on board. Already several discoveries unique in marine science have been made. The Pacific is practically a virgin field, and its utmost depths are being probed in search for fresh specimens.

One specimen of particular interest in sea science is the deep-sea angler fish. It is a very hungry individual, its mouth extending nearly the entire length of its body. It needs a big mouth, too, for besides supporting itself it reverses the accepted custom of life and supports not only one but up to half a dozen males, much smaller and weaker fish, unable to get food for themselves. From different parts of its body can be seen insignificant males, small and pale, compared to the brown and the robust female. They attach themselves to the female of the species by blood vessels and get nourishment from the hard-working female in this manner.
