DR. KNIGHT IN SUMMERSIDE.—Dr. A. P. Knight, chairman of the Biological Board of Canada, is in Summerside looking into the condition of the lobster industry. He attributes the failure of this year to two chief causes: too many boats—too many men, too many boats and too much gear. Dr. Knight claims that the south-shore fishermen made a mistake five years ago when they asked and obtained from the Dominion Government the privilege of fishing from August 15th to September 30th; this is part of the breeding season of the lobster. Right up to the time that the eggs are laid, fishermen are daily killing thousands of females which contain millions of eggs. This is the second great cause of failure of the late season catch this year in the lobster supply. Dr. Knight says he has been going on slowly and steadily for the past thirty years. If the fishermen of the late season are not willing to abolish it, and protect the breeding males the fishermen can only look forward to a diminishing supply for the future. Dr. Knight says there is a decided improvement in the building equipment and sanitation of the lobster factories in this Province within the past three years. The big lack now, he declares, is the need of training of superintendents.
