Nine-day Search Fails To Locate Bodies In Harbor

Nightfall yesterday saw the end of a nine-day search for the bodies of Reginald Paoli, 21 and Mary McKearney, 20, both of Charlottetown, believed drowned on the afternoon of Monday.

Yesterday numerous boats kept sharp lookout on harbor waters as it was expected the bodies would float.

Two young people were believed drowned from their small sail boat. Although there were no eye-witnesses of the accident it is believed to have occurred not far from the entrance to the harbor.

The sail boat, with the small lug sail still hoisted, was seen below the light directed ashore from the harbor mouth late in the afternoon. Investigation revealed a man and a woman's clothing in the boat as well as lunch which had been untouched. The couple was reported missing next morning and articles in the boat, identified as belonging to them, were found in the water.
